Enclosed for the Bureau are six 8 x 10 photographs numbered 1 through 6 on the reverse of each photograph, which were furnished to the Memphis Office by [REDACTED]

Photograph #1 depicts demonstrators in the front of Clayborn Temple, 280 Hernando, Memphis, on the late afternoon of 11/10/69. It was this group which some 15 minutes after the photograph was taken threw rocks and bottles at police officers maintaining a barricade one block north of the location of this photograph which resulted in the arrest of 53 demonstrators, the use of teargas to repel the demonstrators, and led to subsequent localized looting and destruction of property at Memphis.

Photograph #2, #3, and #4 reflect damage done to buildings and to a motorcycle which was firebombed after the above group was repelled by teargas by the Memphis Police Department.

Photographs #5 and #6 reflect Negro school children running from Manassas High School on the morning of 11/17/69 at the urging of the NAACP which is attempting to boycott Memphis City Schools. These Negro youths caused some damage to school property upon leaving the school and required the Memphis Police Department to break up the groups into small groups and to prevent these Negro children from marching on downtown Memphis, Tennessee.

He is also currently believed to be free on a \$25,000 appeal bond following a conviction on 1/4/68, for possession of weapons during the July, 1967, riots, in Newark.

Newark is requested to determine if [redacted] is still under this appeal bond, and, if so, to determine if any travel restrictions have been placed against him by any court and/or parole or probation department.

If he is not so restricted through the Appeal Bond, Newark is requested to determine if [redacted] is restricted in either travel or speaking through any condition of probation he may presently be under.

It is felt by San Diego that, in view of the fact [redacted] is prominent in the black militant movement and now appears to be associated with US, he should be targeted for the Counterintelligence Program to possibly preclude the firm establishment of a chapter of US on the east coast.

For the information of the Bureau, the enclosed newspaper article appeared in the 10/25/69 issue of the BPP. The article, which is an attack on RON KARENGA of the US organization, is self-explanatory. It is felt that if the following letter be sent to KARENGA, pointing out that the contents of the article are objectionable to members of the US organization in San Diego, the possibility exists that some sort of retaliatory action will be taken against the BPP.

The Bureau is therefore requested to approve sending the following letter anonymously to RON KARENGA in Los Angeles:

"Msaada, Maulana!

"Maulana, I'm sending you an article the panther pigs here in San Diego think is way out.

"What are we going to do about it? We don't feel we can just let it pass, but don't want to move on it without your okay.

"Do you have any ideas?"

BLACK THING CO-OPTED

Ron "Malloping" Karenga, founder and misleading bourgeois priest of the US organization and cultural nationalism, must be described as being synonymous to the lying, murdering, demagogic pigs of the USA's organization, the CIA. But perhaps he is one lower than the usual run of the mill pig, because he has sold out and he is still selling out. He is using his Black skin and the soul knowledge embodied in his bald head to mesmerize Black people, to lead the people into believing a dashiki is more powerful than a pig's speeding bullet. The reason that pork chop nationalists have been able to get people to support their banner, which is manifested in a teaspoon of apolitical rhetoric, is because Black people are looking for something, for anything functional to eliminate the oppressor country fascists that have gone crazy, misreading, denying, and murdering them.

When rebellion sprang out in the colony, it was very beneficial for some greedy, articulate, nigger with a beard, bald head, and shades to take to the podium expounding on a Black-and-proud line, with slogans appealing (not necessarily helpful) to oppressed ears. This has been the basis for the coming together of the cultural nationalist in the Black colony of Babylon. In the outset, the pig power structure saw this as an advantage. They (the pigs) knew Black people were moving in a new direction, even though the direction is what they were moving was predetermined. It

was expressing itself in more violent terms. So the fascists put blood money into the colony and the pork chops slid into the melting pot. Now they are full-fledged pigs, out to corral and pacify a new wave called the "Black thing". The aim is to turn it toward Black capitalism.

So with the help of pig money, the cultural nationalists are sponsoring Black. When we have the occasion to check out various news media, Blackness is now in vogue. It has become as commercial as Coca Cola, an inroad to capitalism.

But the aim of double O agent Karenga and his elite core is not to make Black capitalists out of Black people, but to keep them at the "buy Black" level, that is customers. So this is the purpose of their doctrine: to build a character around Blackness deeply embodied with 16th century Africa and western styled burkas with matching bell bottoms, hoping that they can build a brainwashing or charisma to make Black people believe being Black, living Black, buying Black, etc. is the essence of liberation. But we say to Karenga, and Jones, and all the rest of their misleading fools who oink at the people, that we are hip to you and will not allow you to erroneously lead the people down the road to capitalism. We have experienced pig capitalism; and for what it's worth we can forget it!

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

At the present time, there are four proposals for counterintelligence action awaiting Bureau evaluation. Immediately upon receipt of the requested information, appropriate counterintelligence action, if indicated, will be requested.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

No new operations have been effected since the date of referenced San Diego letter to the Bureau of 11/10/69.

On 11/14/69, [redacted] was recontacted and advised that he has not yet received results of inquiries he has submitted concerning IRS forms which should have been submitted by the US organization.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

No tangible results in addition to those reported in referenced San Diego letter to the Bureau of 11/10/69, have been observed. Neither have any tangible results been reported to San Diego by any auxiliary offices concerning counterintelligence action instituted by the San Diego Division.

Sacramento has no accomplishments to report during the past two-week period and has no counter-intelligence measures under consideration at this time.

As was pointed out in relet, this office has been endeavoring to develop a logical counterintelligence program; however, the BPP in this division has been almost dormant and no reasonable measure has been devised.

As will be reported in the next BPP report, the three BPP chapter headquarters within this division have closed. Chapters in Fresno, Vallejo and Sacramento are apparently in serious financial and organizational difficulty and have been forced to give up their headquarters. The Breakfast for Children Programs and the Liberation Schools which had been operating in Vallejo and Sacramento have also been eliminated. At present the BPP is not known to be operating in an organized fashion from any other headquarters location. This apparent complete disorganization of the Party at present makes it impossible to develop a logical counterintelligence program, inasmuch as many members have drifted away and the Party is not operative.

This matter will be closely followed and every effort will be made to develop a suitable counterintelligence measure if it appears that the Party is becoming reorganized within this division.

Information contained in re San Francisco airtel regarding [redacted] displeasure with [redacted] was reviewed in the New Haven Division upon receipt for possible counter-intelligence exploitation. It is felt, however, that the time lag involved in following upon this information was excessive and would therefore be ineffectual and possibly expose the original source of information.

From information received, it would not appear that BPP Headquarters is at the present time presently displeased with [redacted] activities on the whole, but rather the incident reported caused [redacted] some displeasure towards [redacted]

The New Haven Division proposes a telephone call purportedly from [redacted] and BPP member, at such time that [redacted] would be out of the company of the BPP-New Haven leadership and rank and file. This call would criticize [redacted] or "not relating" to the local situation and being more concerned with demonstrations with Yale and MIT white radicals. [redacted] has been placed at the recent disturbances at Yale and M.I.T.

It is felt that this proposal would have a dual effect. (1) Causing an inquiry to be made of the relevancy of [redacted] activities, and (2) cause distrust in the local chapter between the [redacted] and the [redacted].

San Francisco is requested to review this proposal and comment on its possible effect.

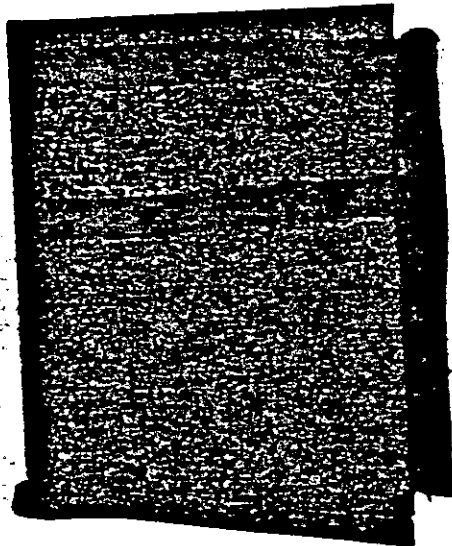

I wish to remain anonymous with regard to the information because in divulging it I may have violated a trust. I feel, however, that what I am writing is important enough that my conscience is clear.

You probably know that [REDACTED] has been involved in anti-war movements here in New Haven. This, [REDACTED] feels, is her right as guaranteed by our Constitution and although some do not agree with her viewpoint, this has never been a cause for concern among those who know her.

[REDACTED] latest escapades, however, are known to a select few, and needless to say those of us who are aware of the situation are deeply concerned as loyal Americans and Christians.

Specifically, I am referring to the fact that [REDACTED]

I recently heard through a close friend of [REDACTED] that he is a revolutionist who advocates overthrowing the Government of the United States and that he has turned over a sizeable sum of money to the Panthers. I can present no evidence of fact, but is it possible [REDACTED] is being influenced by Communists? Some statements he has made both in church and out have led me to believe he is either a Communist himself, or so left-wing that the only thing he lacks is a card.

I consider myself a liberal, as do many of the people in the church. [REDACTED] however, has taken not one but many steps beyond liberalism and I sincerely question his loyalty.

Markle Turns Down Meeting On Panthers

State's Atty. Arnold Markle today refused to meet with a local group seeking release on bail or recognition of the 12 Black Panther party members charged here with murder.

In an early morning confrontation at his office in the State Courthouse, Markle said he was barred from talking with the group and cited Superior Court Judge Aaron Palmer's recently issued order against pre-trial statements by those involved in the case.

After hearing these remarks from Markle, the five-member group, which included the Rev. Wade Eaton and Dr. Robert Abramovitz, then left the office to hold a press conference.

Over the weekend, the group reportedly received a telegram from Markle in which he declined to meet with them. Last Friday, Markle said he knew the group was coming to his office and he couldn't stop them from coming.

The delegation is representative of some 14 New Haven groups which claim the confinement of the 12 defendants without bail is unconstitutional.

The 12, including two men who are still fighting extradition in Colorado, are charged with having participated in the murder last May of alleged Black Panther informer Alex Rackley.

Rackley, 24, was reportedly kidnapped from New York City, taken to a New Haven apartment and tortured at a "kangaroo trial" by the defendants. He was then allegedly taken to Middlefield, slain and his body dumped into a swamp.

The 10 Black Panther party members being held in Connecticut, in connection with the murder, are now being held in various jails throughout the state.

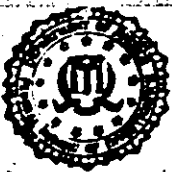

The first source, whose reliability is not known, on [redacted] furnished a copy of a single mimeographed sheet published by the "Movement Liberation Front" (MLF). This sheet describes the objective of the front as organizing the "Movement" around ways of dealing with the legal system. It states that the MLF believes that the radical movement has been failing in its methods of dealing with the increasing repression. It states that the MLF was working with the International Liberation School organized in Berkeley by Tom Hayden and Stewart Albert, in starting a course in law as it effects the movement. It stated that the MLF also works with other community groups involved with radical politics by providing legal seminars and issuing a legal service of press releases on legal topics for the underground press. This mimeographed sheet stated that a project of the MLF has been preparation of a Radical Defense Handbook, which devotes itself to various legal and extra-legal tactics, and that the tone is set in the opening preamble which it quotes as follows: "...the legal system ... is one more institution to discredit and delegitimize ..."

A review of a copy of the Radical Defense Handbook reflects the following additional comments printed in its introduction:

"Judges get appointed to the bench after years of faithful service to the local, regional, state and in higher courts national political machines. They are with rare exceptions the reliable instruments of the power structure. The exceptions find themselves excluded from judging political cases. The courts are our enemies just as the police and the regents are."

Another section of the introduction to the Radical Defense Handbook reads as follows:

"As long as people are willing to recognize the legitimacy of the legal system's authority over them, then--or at long as they refuse to deal with it--they make it quite easy for the courts to control people and crush movements. If, on the other hand, we view this as one area around which to organize, and one more institution to discredit and delegitimize as we are doing with the colleges, high schools and political parties--
ONE MORE BATTLEGROUND--these cases can be turned to our advantage."

[REDACTED] was one of three panel members at a "Conference on Revolution" at California State College at Long Beach on February 11, 1969. During the question and answer period, [REDACTED] stated that he believes in the teachings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung; that he is not a pacifist and believes that violence is necessary to create a situation that will eliminate violence; that he has a rifle and a shotgun and is willing to shoot.

Third Source

A fourth source on [REDACTED] reported that [REDACTED] Bobby Seale and [REDACTED] to attend an International Liberation School meeting at his place that night.

Bobby Seale is Chairman of the EPP and is one of eight defendants in the anti-riot laws conspiracy case currently being conducted in Chicago.

[REDACTED] furnished a one-page leaflet of the International Liberation School, 1929 Grove Street, Berkeley, which stated that their purpose was to study and discuss how the American political and economic system works; where its weaknesses lie; how to change it fundamentally. It stated that as revolutionaries in the Marxist tradition, they relate to the Third World struggles, the youth and cultural rebellion, women's liberation and the working class.

**BLACK PANTHER PARTY, aka
Black Panther Party for
Self Defense**

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby George Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

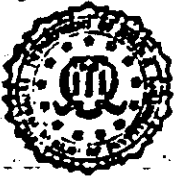

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students For A Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. MICHAEL KLONSKY, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa, and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam, and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

A characterization of the BPP is attached hereto as an Appendix.

[REDACTED] also appeared at Sacramento State College (SSC) on the evening of October 30, 1969, in the Men's Gymnasium to speak before SSC class, "Rebellion in America". The program was sponsored by the school's Cultural Programs Committee.

Speeches at both campuses were very similar and some points discussed were as follows:

[REDACTED] went on the alleged irrelevance and obsolescence of American jurisprudence to the contemporary needs of the American people, particularly the underprivileged, the minorities and the militants. He said the system in America should be changed because it "stinks".

[REDACTED] said the BPT was a responsible organization and in referring to Bobby Seale's outburst at the "Chicago Eight" trial, he said that Seale just got sick and tired of this "horse manure" and called the judge "a Fascist racist and a low-down scoundrel".

[REDACTED] called all Grand Juries "hand-picked" for the country-club set by judges who were close friends and said the nation was filled with "white, middle-class, old jurors". He said the blacks get "half-assed" justice from "the God-damn system" and concluded by saying, "I'm ashamed to be an American lawyer."

[REDACTED] followed [REDACTED] and started by saying that they had a right to rebel; that they were prepared to die and kill to protect self and family; and that the Party was moving in the direction of community control because it was the only direction they could take.

[REDACTED] promised a firing squad for "warring" Nixon, the "permanent elimination" of Governor Reagan, and a war in America. He voiced hatred for "Fascist racist judges", pigs and the University of California Board of Regents. He said, "We'll eliminate these people permanently and wage revolution if they stand in the way of our progress." He said, "We'll give the President another Vietnam here" and followed with the statement that the President did not deserve anything short of a firing squad.

Approximately 1,500 people attended the appearance at SSC, the vast majority being white. Present at the UCD affair were from 400 to 500 people.

The device consists of a one-half pint size can of Sterno. Four Western Winchester .38 caliber, 158 grain bullet cartridges were pressed into the Sterno compound with the bases toward the bottom of the can. A fifth cartridge, of the same make, was laid on top of the compound. The device was not fired and the store sustained no damage. [REDACTED] Seattle Fire Department, is of the opinion that had the can been lighted, the cartridges would not have exploded, because the alcohol fumes would have burned over the opening of the can and would not have been in direct contact with the cartridges; he does not believe the heat below the flame would have been sufficient to set off the cartridges. This is based on previous tests he has conducted. [REDACTED]

According to confidential San Francisco sources, on 10/15/69, [redacted] was summoned to San Francisco apparently because National BPP had not approved his trip to Washington or submission of his alleged evidence to the sub-committee. [redacted] and returned the same date. It is assumed [redacted] explained his position to National BPP leaders while in San Francisco.

For the information of the Bureau and San Francisco, on 10/10/69, it was locally publicized in Kansas City newspapers that [redacted] was allegedly wounded in the right arm. This and subsequent local news items attributed conflicting statements to [redacted]. In one, [redacted] claimed a Minuteman shot him from a passing car. In another, [redacted] indicated this statement was untrue. The above news accounts and those relating to [redacted] trip to and from Washington, D.C. strongly suggest that [redacted] made all of his news releases, without foundation, to hold up Chief of Police KEELLEY, Kansas City, Mo. PD, to ridicule and to publicize [redacted]. It is noted the 10/25/69 issue of The Black Panther newspaper contained an article re this incident, which claimed the shooting was done by agents of the police to prevent [redacted] from testifying in Washington, D.C. (Another example of conflicting statements by [redacted].)

It is noted that [redacted] was accompanied to Washington, D.C. by two trusted associates, and he was accompanied to San Francisco by a trusted associate. It is assumed he has explained his position to the BPP leaders in San Francisco. The article in The Black Panther newspaper indicates BPs presently are blaming the establishment for attempting to stop [redacted] from testifying.

In view of the above, the opinion of the Kansas City Office is that an anonymous telephone contact with the National BPP to discredit [redacted] may now be questionable as [redacted] has undoubtedly explained his activity on 10/16/69 to National BPP, and could use [redacted] and [redacted] as supporting witnesses re [redacted] conduct in Washington. Though such an anonymous telephone contact could not be traced, both National BPP and [redacted] and his local associates would probably suspect the anonymous call to be the product of BPP defectors or law enforcement. [redacted] probably would use any knowledge of such a call to enhance his position with his own small chapter staff and membership.

An anonymous call just prior to [redacted] arrival with [redacted] at National BPP headquarters 10/16/69 would certainly have been more timely. However, there appears to be a substantial question that such a call would have resulted adversely to [redacted] or his chapter, again due to the small, close-knit leadership staff and membership of the local chapter.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

Four requests for counterintelligence action are presently awaiting Bureau evaluation.

① One of these requests concerns an anonymous letter directed to BPP headquarters, Oakland, objecting to BPP headquarters, San Diego, being utilized for sex orgies. Another concerns a letter to BPP headquarters, Los Angeles, objecting to activities of [redacted] in San Diego.

③ The third request concerns an article which appeared in the BPP newspaper of 10/25/69. This article attacks [redacted]. A request has been made to mail the article to [redacted] and urge retaliatory action.

④ The fourth request concerns a possible raid conducted on BPP headquarters, [redacted].

Newark is being requested by separate communication to determine if [redacted] is prohibited from travelling outside the immediate Newark area by any court order and/or probation or parole department order. If it did, Bureau permission will be requested to invite [redacted] to speak at Los Angeles and/or San Diego areas. And, if the invitation is accepted, would result in the violation of the above mentioned conditions and possibly be culminated in the arrest of [redacted].

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

Bureau approved information regarding the incorporation of US, Incorporated, has been furnished to [REDACTED]

On 11/7/69, [REDACTED] advised that he has made appropriate inquiries concerning whether or not this group has filed the necessary forms and expects results of his inquiries in approximately two weeks. [REDACTED] stated that he has requested information as to whether or not US filed the appropriate forms for the years 1967 and 1968.

No results have thus far been obtained from the Los Angeles Division concerning any reaction to the Bureau approved anonymous letter mailed to [REDACTED] concerning the white men who attended an US meeting.

Results are being observed concerning the Bureau approved information furnished to [REDACTED] of Governor REAGAN's office. The Bureau is requested to see the following section of this letter for results thus far observed.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

Since the Bureau approved telephone call was placed to [REDACTED] concerning [REDACTED] being a "pig", the accusations against [REDACTED] have continued by various members of the BPP, [REDACTED]. The results of these accusations came to a climax about two and one half weeks ago and approximately two weeks ago [REDACTED] was kicked out of the BPP for being a "pig" and for "not relating right." At the present time, the San Diego members of the BPP are looking for [REDACTED] who is in hiding, apparently for the purpose of beating him up.

On 11/4/69, local news media carried a story reflecting that State Senators and Representatives in California have launched a statewide investigation into the misappropriation of funds designated for the various state colleges. This investigation follows, within one week, information received from [REDACTED] of Governor REAGAN's office, that she had made the Bureau approved confidential information available to the Governor on a confidential basis. It is felt that the Bureau approved information furnished to [REDACTED] on 9/19/69, contributed greatly or was solely responsible for the above mentioned investigation presently being conducted by the state.

IV.

DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

At the present time things are unusually quiet in the Southeast section of San Diego. No recent conflicts have been noted between the rival militant US and BPP groups. There is, however, some internal strife within the BPP concerning the sex orgies at BPP headquarters. Counterintelligence action has been requested in this regard.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both appear to be out of the BPP at the present time. BPP members are reportedly looking for [REDACTED] in an effort to administer a beating to him.

[REDACTED] advised that a review of the visiting records of HUEY NEWTON failed to reflect that [REDACTED] as visited or attempted to visit NEWTON at that facility.

A copy of NEWTON's visiting record is being furnished to the San Francisco Office.

Information appearing in referenced airtel was not furnished to [REDACTED] however, he was questioned as to the possibility of NEWTON making a tape and having it smuggled out of the prison. [REDACTED] advised that because of court rulings, attorneys are allowed to bring tape recorders into the institution and to tape interviews with the inmates. He noted that the recordings are supposed to be for legal work and the institution does not play them back or know the contents of the recordings because it is considered privileged communication between attorney and client. He noted that one of NEWTON's attorneys, [REDACTED] always brings a recorder to the institution.

[REDACTED] also noted that NEWTON could make a tape in the institution and pass it to an attorney. NEWTON is searched before he talks to visitors and his attorney, and stripped search after visits. He further noted that visitors pass through a metal detector before visiting inmates.

Enclosed for the Bureau are two Xerox copies of an editorial which appeared in the St. Louis American, a local weekly Negro-oriented newspaper on 10/30/69.

BACKGROUND

As the Bureau is aware, the Veiled Prophet Ball, an annual event which begins the St. Louis social season, has been the subject of bitter attack by ACTION, a local black activist group, for the past several years. In recent years ACTION has participated in demonstrations and disruptions aimed at ending both the Veiled Prophet Ball and the Veiled Prophet Parade. The membership of ACTION has been attempting to convince St. Louis residents, primarily the black community, that the Veiled Prophet Ball is a "white racist institution".

m

The enclosed editorial appeared on page 8 of the October 30, 1969, edition of the St. Louis American. It criticizes the black militants who have been attempting to disrupt and distort the Veiled Prophet Ball and points out that the event is not really distasteful nor detrimental to the black community.

Although ACTION is a black activist group its membership includes several whites. These individuals have been successful in convincing a few white churchmen to side with ACTION in calling for an end to Veiled Prophet "racism".

RECOMMENDATION

The St. Louis Division proposes to anonymously mail copies of this editorial to all white members of ACTION

as well as white ministers who have publicly stated their support of ACTION's demand for an end to the Veiled Prophet Ball. It is unlikely that these people would have had the opportunity to read this editorial inasmuch as the St. Louis American is a Negro newspaper with a relatively limited circulation. It is believed that the editorial from a Negro editor would have a great deal of influence on their thinking in regards to the Veiled Prophet Ball. It is conceivable that the editorial may even convince them to withdraw their support of ACTION's demands and the resulting loss of support could, therefore, result in a lessening of racial tension next year at the time of the Veiled Prophet Ball.

Bureau authority is requested to initiate the above counterintelligence operation. The number of mailings, which would not exceed 30 in number, would be affected through the use of commercially purchased stationery. St. Louis informants and sources should be able to furnish the results and reaction of the individuals involved concerning this counterintelligence operation.

EDITORIALS

WHY NOT FIRST DIG THE TRUE HISTORY OF THE VEILED PROPHET?

In this day of supposed "enlightenment" over things historic—especially where there is a shadow of blacks—there was something immature and astute about the protest of the group of good Episcopals against the Veiled Prophet celebration here in St. Louis. Their criticism of the annual affair has a blemish, but their "reasons" are not based on the historic facts. It is factually wrong to associate the Veiled Prophet and its matrix the New Orleans Mardi Gras with any Southern plantation way of life.

The editors of the Veiled Prophet at least should check the history, or not allow those who seek to disrupt and distort any and all of the "establishment's" show-offs without a constructive program to offer in substitute. For years on years the Veiled Prophet and its model the Mardi Gras have been severely criticized, but never for portraying or upholding the old slave South and its criminal magnolia-crepe-jasmine fiction.

A quick search will reveal that the St. Louis Veiled Prophet affair began in 1878. A more thorough search will also reveal that this was a time of the rise of organized labor, and that the new social affair had anti-labor overtones. At that time striking labor did not regard the Negro, and called him a "black scab".

The idea was an imitation of the New Orleans annual Mardi Gras without the Catholic Lenten season feature. However, the New Orleans present celebration that indulged in festivities that would never have been permitted on the plantations, was in fact preceded by a similar celebration in Mobile, where it was originated. Both of these antecedents used foreign names and terms that would be an insult to any plantation owner. In Mobile it was "Coubellion de Rakin", and in New Orleans it was "mystic Krowe, with Comus, Mumus, Nereus and their train of revelers -- all called Mardi Gras". The plantation owners could not even pronounce those "furrin" words.

In St. Louis the modification was towards the Masonic mysteries and the terms of the "hot sands of Arabs" were used -- thus the mystic ruler with the title "The Mysterious Veiled Prophet of Mooristan".

Coming to the insinuation that the St. Louis Veiled Prophet affair is distasteful to Negroes because it connotes the old plantation way of life. This is also a faulty conclusion because, facts here it out, the plantation per se is not the real blame. There are two ready examples.

A close study of American plantation life (and you would see our young black intellectuals to dig this) will show that the plantation did their way of life on the Greek State. The reputable historian V. L. Parrington confirms this.

"Many Southerners gave up the idea of becoming imperfect feudal lords and tried the experiment of becoming imperfect ancient Greeks. Caught between two forces of a Jeffersonian democracy and a slave economy, Southern thought found in Greek ideal the most natural compromise. Since manual labor was black, a white skin was a guarantee against serfdom, and the common race prejudice was accounted sufficient to draw even the poor whites to the support of slavery. The Greek ideal of a mudsill held class to support their ruling class met the double needs of the Southern plantation economics and cultural claims."

In further acceptance of this Greek "concept" the plantation owners went in for a whole-scale architectural change, building plantation mansions with great white Corinthian and Doric columns which is known in our American history as the "Greek Revival" era.

Now, my dears, would it be logical to remove our various (fraternity and sorority) black members of aying and fellow system that is distasteful to all Negroes because of its plantation connection? By no means! The plantation use of the Greek way is really the ultimate test of the virtues of the Greeks. Nor would be in asking for the abolition of the Veiled Prophet affair -- does not even accommodate the old plantation concept an old Greek "mudsill" acceptance.

The second observation on our St. Louis Veiled Prophet celebration is the very obvious one. For a number of years the A group has led the confrontation of the Veiled Prophet celebration parade and grand ball. But the thrust of the action has been "let us inside -- let us blacks participate. And they have their own annual Black Veiled Prophet celebration. It has been criticized for this in a free country, and it has led to judge protests. But what of this new celebration -- being distasteful and hurting all blacks' morale? Is this in such a deleterious affair? Why imitate it? Why is this basic fault and insult early declared and the protest at this point? . . .

We are all a part and parcel of the American people, and all the brain-washed fantasies about "black on black" and the overwhelming majority of us "black folks" are doing it -- reproducing and dying right here in the U.S. -- and we are allowed to participate in its tankies and social amenities. Has not been privileged to attend an after-demonstration of the "power" brothers and count the "blue-eyed blind" there? That's another stubborn fact that is compromising history shall reveal. And right here, what of it? . . .

As for the local Veiled Prophet, the aging editorial continues to think it is frothy and of honey which is prescribed mainly for our American people. There are thousands, regardless of racial affiliation, who get a real pleasure out of the show. But there are thousands who do it by without a care, one way or the other. Who could blame?

Pittsburgh should immediately advise the Bureau of the identity of this individual, if possible, and submit counterintelligence recommendations designed to prevent the RNA from using public property for its convention.

Pittsburgh should also advise Detroit and Philadelphia of the identity of this individual and each office should also submit recommendations in this matter. No counterintelligence action should be taken without Bureau authority.

This counterintelligence undertaking was developed and carried out through the efforts of these individuals and through their personal contacts and relationship with [REDACTED]

The necessary information was developed and presented in such a manner that the station could obtain public source material from which to produce this film without the Bureau's interest becoming evident. Each and every film segment produced by the station was submitted for our scrutiny to insure that we were satisfied and that nothing was included which could in any way be contrary to our interests.

The final 30-minute color documentary evolving out of these efforts was captioned "Fear of the Secret Dark" and was presented [REDACTED] to insure maximum exposure. The station not only utilized prime time but also did considerable local advertising prior to the showing of this program, which had an audience rating in excess of 200,000.

The local interest created by this program far exceeded the station's expectations and the station has since received numerous favorable comments, along with requests that copies of the documentary film be made available for local showings.

The program did an outstanding job in accomplishing the goals desired in exposing the NOI, its background, ideology and exploitation of the black community.

The immediate tangible results obtained indicate that considerable dissension has been created in the local Mosque, which should be highly significant in its ability to extract money from the membership and/or increase its membership. Further, information has just been received that the local minister has been transferred.

As a result of the creative abilities of these Agents, another highly successful counterintelligence undertaking has been accomplished by the Miami Division. The efficient manner

in which this undertaking was accomplished and the results obtained in this coordinated effort are most noteworthy.

In further appreciation of the assistance received in the producing of this film, [REDACTED] has made available to the Bureau at no cost a 16 mm copy of the original Cinescope tape. This film has been forwarded to the Bureau with referenced Miami letter of 10/23/69.

It is recommended that individual letters of commendation be directed to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] for their outstanding contributions in this highly successful counterintelligence accomplishment.

All three of the above Agents are within the Bureau's desired weight range.

ADDENDUM: Domestic Intelligence Division, 10-29-69, TJD:drl:

The Domestic Intelligence Division concurs with the recommendations of the Special Agent in Charge, Miami. By memorandum G.C. Moore to Mr. W. C. Sullivan dated 10-21-69, prepared by TJD:ekw, captioned as above, the facts of this operation were set out and the valuable results were described. The Director noted "Excellent" on this memorandum.

We authorized Miami to cooperate with an established source [REDACTED], to prepare program exposing black extremist Nation of Islam (NOI). The program resulted in much favorable comment by the audience; NOI leaders plan a rebuttal in the NOI newspaper and attendance by visitors at weekly NOI meetings has dropped 50 percent since the program. This was the result of personal contacts by three Special Agents with the [REDACTED] (handles the Counterintelligence Program), and [REDACTED]. (Racial [REDACTED] are recommended for commendation for their handling of this excellent operation. [REDACTED]

5. Method of packaging, addressing and mailing.
In this connection it would be helpful to know if protective packaging is utilized or whether regularly available commercial mailing carton is used.

6. Any other available information regarding the handling of these tapes.

The use of tapes for transmitting reports to national headquarters suggests the counterintelligence possibility of preparing and mailing tapes containing disruptive, erroneous information. Also under certain circumstances it may be feasible to erase or distort these tapes making them valueless to the recipient.

Comments of recipient offices concerning these or other possibilities which they may suggest themselves are invited.

Handle promptly and furnish results to Bureau and San Francisco.

NOTE:

The recent information concerning the use of tapes to send reports to BPP headquarters suggests the possibility of certain counterintelligence techniques as outlined above in addition to others which may be suggested by the field. In order to determine if further consideration along these lines is warranted, the primary survey as requested in this letter is in order.

Referenced communication sets forth details of an instance which occurred at St. Francis Catholic Church, Ann Arbor, Michigan, [redacted] a black militant Security Index subject, flagged as an "Anarchist", appeared before the 10:30 a.m. mass that date to deliver the "Black Manifesto", demanding \$5,000.00 reparations from that parish to augment payments to ADC recipients and to help finance his campaign for the recall of the sheriff of Washtenaw County, Michigan.

Subject's appearance caused a considerable stir in this parish, and he allegedly has threatened to persist in his efforts until he obtains the demanded funds.

Referenced teletype noted that subject [redacted] is a diagnosed skitzoid-paranoid personality with latent homicidal and suicidal tendencies. He is regarded as a dangerous person with a propensity for violence, and the Direct Action Committee, which he formerly headed as a black militant organization, has perpetrated at least one act of violence in the past against the Ann Arbor PD.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS IN EFFECT AGAINST THE LOS ANGELES BLACK PANTHER PARTY (LABPP)

The Counterintelligence Operation proposed in Los Angeles letter to the Bureau dated 10/20/69, is being held in abeyance pending Bureau approval.

Exhaustive interviews of suspected members of the LABPP continue and are serving to create distrust among activists and the defection of peripheral members.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

A survey of toll calls of selected LABPP leaders continues, with the result of these reviews being considered for counterintelligence proposals.

The Los Angeles Division continues to follow arrests of members of the LABPP for violations of Anti-Riot and Gun Control laws, to determine if any of these individuals might be prosecuted under Federal or State laws. Liaison with logical sporting goods stores and firearms outlets continues in an effort to identify members of the LABPP purchasing firearms.

The daily activities of members are being closely scrutinized for violation of local laws so that this information can be furnished to local law enforcement agencies for appropriate action.

ReSIAirtel 10/31/69 captioned "Speech of Fred Hampton, Chairman, Illinois Black Panther Party (BPP), Normal, Illinois, 10/29/69, RM; IS - SDS."

Reairtel noted that at a speech by Fred Hampton, Chairman of the Illinois Black Panther Party (BPP), attendees were required to submit to comprehensive searches of their person without prior notice. The searches were conducted by white persons dressed in hippie clothing.

Chicago and Springfield should submit recommendations for counterintelligence action to exploit this situation, and possibly to prevent future searches of this type, which interfere with our coverage of public speeches by black extremists. Consideration might be given to preparing letters to campus or local newspapers protesting "facist and police state tactics." The use of white hippies as security for the appearance of a Black Panther leader might also be appropriately brought to the attention of BPP headquarters. Chicago and Springfield should give this matter imaginative thought and submit recommendations as soon as possible. No counterintelligence action should be taken without Bureau authority.

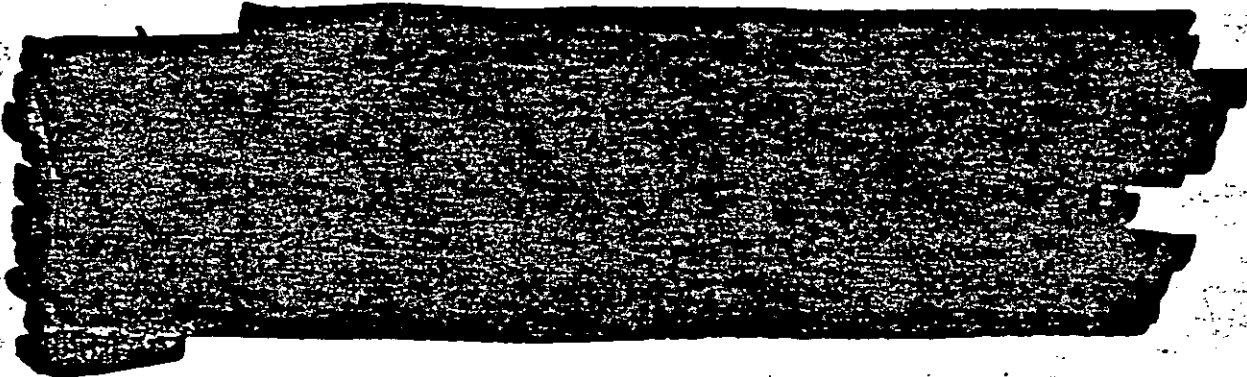

The following successful counterintelligence action taken by the NYO with respect to the Black Panther Party (BPP) Breakfast Program is set forth for information purposes.

On 10/28/69, information was received that [redacted] had contacted [redacted] somewhere in New York, and made arrangements to institute a Breakfast Program at the church.

Investigation by the NYO determined that the church referred to was probably [redacted] and the priest possibly one Father [redacted]

[redacted] was interviewed by [redacted] and [redacted]. He stated that he had been approached by one [redacted] from the BPP on 10/27/69. She requested space at [redacted] in order that the BPP could serve free breakfast to the local children. She said the food would be solicited from local merchants, the BPP would serve it and the BPP would clean the premises after breakfast.

[redacted] stated that he readily agreed to the program but stipulated to [redacted] that no political overtures could be made to the children. She agreed and he approved of the program which was to begin on 11/3/69. [redacted] stated that he was aware of the reputation of the BPP, but felt that he could oversee the program and control it fully.

The interviewing agents proceeded to fully discuss the BPP with [redacted]. It was pointed out to him that while, as he stated, he is aware of the BPP reputation, such action on his part would provide the BPP with an aura of respectability. The agents related to him the problems which could arise should he one day decide to discontinue the program after it started. Children would

have been indoctrinated with BPP ideology, others in his school would be recruited into the BPP, parents would be discontented with a discontinuation of free breakfast and local merchants would be chagrined at possibly being forcibly persuaded to give free food to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] appeared apprehensive at the possible repercussions of such a program and stated that he knew of no way to call it off at this late date.

He was advised that another Pastor, in a similar situation, called a meeting of his Parish Council (PC) submitted the BPP program to them and by unanimous vote the PC voted against the idea.

[REDACTED] thanked the agents for their consideration of his problem and expressed his appreciation for the FBI alerting him to what could have been a disastrous situation. In conclusion, he stated that he would call an emergency meeting of his non-existent Parish Council and advise the BPP of the decision not to have a BPP sponsored Free Breakfast Program.

On 11/3/69, [REDACTED] was recontacted at which time he stated that the BPP Free Breakfast Program did not begin as planned on this date nor would he permit it at [REDACTED] in the future.

Nothing has transpired with the Denver group of the BPP in the past two weeks.

There is very little activity in the Denver group and it appears, according to informants, that the Denver group will disband after [redacted] and [redacted] are extradited to New Haven, Connecticut, to stand trial for the [redacted] murder. They are currently incarcerated in Denver County Jail without bond.

The Denver group is currently being controlled by out-of-town members of the Panthers who are getting no support and their own morale is at a low ebb. It is felt that there is nothing Denver can do at the present time to make matters in the Denver group any worse than their own current position.

If, in the meantime, anything transpires in the matter of counterintelligence, the proposal will be submitted to the Bureau at that time.

In view of the above information, Denver will discontinue its biweekly letter under instant caption, UACB.

Enclosed for the Bureau and Chicago is one copy each of a TV manuscript.

The documentary expose of the Nation of Islam was presented at [redacted] This program received maximum exposure, not only because it was presented on prime TV time, but because it was a half hour show placed between two highly rated network programs. The audience rating for this show was in excess of 200,000.

The program received considerable advance publicity through the local newspapers' Sunday TV Section and through a preview which appeared in the TV Section of the Oct. 8, 1969 edition of the Miami Herald. The program also was the subject of numerous spot announcements, as well as news reports for the days immediately preceding Oct. 9th.

[redacted] advised on 10/14/69 that considerable problems were experienced in the preparation of the program. The refusal by NOI officers and members to be interviewed created a serious lack of visual material believed to be necessary for this

type of program and consideration was given to dropping the program.

they did go through with the program. He said that he is very happy that this program was presented, as it turned out, in his opinion, to be an excellent program, one that has done a service to the community and has reflected favorably on the public image of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said that the audience response was much greater than had been anticipated and that telephone calls received at the conclusion of the program were so numerous that the switchboard was unable to handle all the calls. He said that if this had been anticipated, extra help would have been assigned to the switchboard so that all phone calls could be handled. He said that approximately 100 phone calls were handled, and all, with the exception of one or two, commented very favorably on the program. He estimated at least 40 - 50 phone calls were unanswered because the switchboard operators could not handle them..

[REDACTED] also said that several community leaders have made favorable comments to him, as well as other executives, and the owners of that TV station, concerning this program.

[REDACTED] further advised that at least three local organizations have asked to borrow the film of this program for showing to their members as a public service. He also advised that the Broward County Sheriff's Office has requested its use for showing to their officers and in connection with their community service program.

The NOI leaders have not denied the facts as presented on this program, but have attempted to justify its points, which they believe present the NOI in an unfavorable or embarrassing light. He said that Mosque 29 officials, in an attempt to offset the unfavorable publicity received through this program, are planning to request permission from ELIJAH MUHAMMAD to prepare a

three-part series for "Muhammad Speaks" to justify the NOI activities as reported in this program.

A member of Mosque 29, when interviewed by Special Agents on 10/13/69, said he believed the program would hurt recruiting efforts of this Mosque, although he did not believe it would have any effect on current membership.

Most of these people have had very little contact with the NOI. They have had a rather favorable impression of that organization because of the clean, neat appearance of members they have seen selling "Muhammad Speaks". He said that through the program they have learned of some of the facts of the NOI and therefore now look upon that organization in a much less favorable light.

The program showed that the leaders of this organization were people of questionable character, it showed the militancy of some of the NOI teachings and the ridiculousness of other teachings. It also clearly showed the large amount of money taken as contributions from the members, through which they received practically no benefits. It pointed out the luxury in which some NOI officials lived.

The Miami Division feels the results of this program are outstanding and should be a definite deterrent to the operation of this organization in the Miami area. The Miami Division also feels that this highly significant counterintelligence undertaking will be of extreme value in its interview program and it will be used during interviews with potential NOI informants.

[REDACTED] advised that the station was going to the expense of having copies made of this program and that one copy will be made available to the Bureau to show their appreciation for Bureau assistance in preparing

the program. He said this film should be available around the 21st of October and when obtained it will be forwarded to the Bureau.

This is to advise of highly successful results of counter-intelligence exposing the black extremist Nation of Islam (NOI) in Miami, Florida.

We previously authorized the Miami Division to cooperate with [REDACTED]. The NOI is a pseudo-religious organization which preaches hatred of the white race. This documentary expose of the NOI was shown [REDACTED] and the audience rating for this show was in excess of 200,000.

[REDACTED] was elated at the response. The station received more favorable telephone calls from viewers than the switchboard could handle. Community leaders have commented favorably on the program, three civic organizations have asked to show the film to their members as a public service, and the Broward County Sheriff's Office plans to show the film to its officers and in connection with its community service program.

This expose showed that NOI leaders are of questionable character and live in luxury through the large amount of money taken as contributions from their members. The extreme nature of NOI teachings was underscored. Miami sources advised the expose has caused considerable concern to local NOI leaders who have attempted to rebutt the program at each open meeting of the NOI since the program was presented. Local NOI leaders plan a rebuttal in the NOI newspaper. Attendance by visitors at weekly NOI meeting has dropped 50%. This shows the value of carefully planned counterintelligence action.

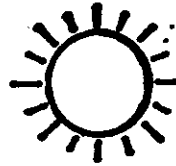

Due to the high "donations" demanded and apparent suspicious goings on regarding meetings and funds collected he stopped attending meetings. He was harassed, badgered and intimidated at his home and work by strongarm men associated with the group's leaders who tried to force him to pay dues and help in raising funds.

After his repeated protests they finally left him alone.

Is there anything that can be done to prevent these outsiders from preying on poor uneducated citizens in Jackson? I understand the group is still active in town.

1. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

The New Haven Division remains alert for counterintelligence possibilities in the BPP Breakfast for Children Program. It should be noted, however, that apparent lack of support by local businesses has inhibited the effectiveness of this program. One Boston source advised recently that eggs would be brought to New Haven from Boston, probably for use in the Breakfast program.

2. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

As authorized by the Bureau, New Haven will continue to furnish public source data to approved press representatives. New Haven will remain alert for those incidents or circumstances which may lend themselves to counterintelligence exploitation.

The New Haven Division is pursuing those investigations which will lead to successful prosecution of BPP members and leadership at the Federal or local level.

3. TANGIBLE RESULTS

The Human Relations Council of Greater New Haven, Inc., charged on October 20, 1969, that the 13 BPP members arrested in connection with the murder of ALEX RACKLEY had been "tried and convicted by the press." Singled out for this attack was the "New Haven Register," which carried a full front page account of the details available to the press immediately following the arrests.

To extend this concern to an attack upon the press for fulfilling its separate and independent duty to provide public information in a criminal case of this gravity is unfair, incorrect, and in itself irresponsible."

This is to advise of the results of a counterintelligence endeavor recently undertaken by the New York Office, which will result in an added expense of thousands of dollars in the shipment of the Black Panther Party (BPP) newspaper publication.

The notorious extremist BPP ships its publication on a weekly basis through [REDACTED]. These papers are packed in wine boxes and sealed with brown paper. Up until recently, [REDACTED] charged the BPP a general rate for printed material. The New York Office had conversations with [REDACTED] and beginning at this time, the BPP will be charged the full legal rate allowable for newspaper shipment. Officials advised that this increase is \$7.50 per 100 weight. This will amount to an increase of around \$300 weekly in shipments to New York City alone. [REDACTED] will impose the full legal tariff on all shipments throughout the country by the BPP. Consideration is being given to a lawsuit to collect past tariffs due.

This counterintelligence endeavor by the New York Office will definitely have an adverse effect on the amount of incendiary propaganda being published by the BPP. The group suffers from a constant shortage of funds. This additional charge will undoubtedly hinder the future growth of the BPP.

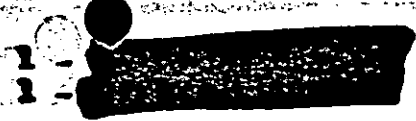

Periodic checks in the vicinity of Black Panther Party (BPP) headquarters at 1209 N. Eden Street, during the months of September and October, reflects that the BPP was not using their record player for the purpose of broadcasting in the neighborhood.

of the Baltimore BPP, was arrested by local police and turned over to the FBI in a Federal warrant issued in California charging subject with UFAP - Burglary. [REDACTED] remains incarcerated at this time.

The arrest of [REDACTED] left the BPP without [REDACTED] in the Baltimore area.

It is felt at this time that with the BPP being without [REDACTED] and the coming of cold weather, the possibility exists that the Baltimore Chapter may be running low on money. If this is the case it is possible that their utilities bills may go unpaid.

It is, therefore, recommended that a discreet contact be made at the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company to determine the status of the BPP account.

If it is found to be unpaid and the company were to turn the utilities off, this could have the effect of splitting the chapter by not having a central meeting place.

Baltimore will not take any specific action until advised by the Bureau.

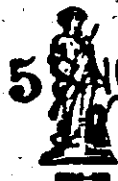

The Indianapolis Division is continuing to interview members of the BPP who are willing to talk to the FBI, who are few in number. One of the members who had been very active at one time, but whose activity had tapered off, was interviewed. During this interview, he was cooperative and he indicated he might be interested in furnishing information to the FBI. He has been contacted on several occasions since that time, at which time he has furnished valuable information and he is now a potential racial informant with very good potential.

The [redacted] was also interviewed, at which time he talked to Agents. While he was not cooperative to the extent that he would become an informant, he did furnish some information through his conversation which was of value. In addition, since the BPP has had a policy of not talking to Agents in Indianapolis, and [redacted]

it served to cause distrust from some of the BPP members toward [redacted]. Some of these members were already somewhat suspicious of [redacted] and his talking to Agents gave them more reason to look at him with distrust. [redacted] however, [redacted]

[redacted] has already made comments indicating he is not sure of [redacted] and any attempts to encourage conflict between the two will be capitalized on.

An article entitled, "Panthers Issue Plea For Help," appeared in the "Milwaukee Sentinel," daily Milwaukee, Wis. newspaper, dated 10/9/69. The article indicated that seven members of the Milwaukee BPP attended a meeting of women's society of the Chapel Hill United Methodist Church, Waukesha, Wis., on 10/8/69. Their attendance was described by the article as a "self-proclaimed mission to inform, educate and solicit help from affluent suburbanites for their 'imprisoned brothers and sisters.'"

LOVETTA BROWN, Field Lt. for the Milwaukee BPP, served as spokesman for the BPP group and told the meeting, "America is going to a fascist state controlled by avaricious people. The state is rising above the people in America and oppressing them."

She stated further, "Maybe you live in this place and don't have the police brutality we have in the black community but the fascist pig cop is the main tool that the ruling element uses to control the masses."

She concluded by saying that the main objective of the BPP is full employment for all blacks and removal of all capitalists from the black community "so we can be independent and determine our own life style."

The article indicated that there was "recurrent applause" during BROWN's speech.

For the information of the Bureau and San Francisco, [redacted] has advised that one of the areas of sensitivity and contention among members of the Detroit BPP is the sale of the BPP newspaper. As a matter of fact one of the members of the Party [redacted]

BPP members in Detroit feel that National BPP Headquarters regard them as little more than newsboys. This is especially evident in the fact that the Detroit Chapter has been closed since 6/69 by order of the National Party; however, the one function that the Detroit Chapter was allowed to continue was sale of the BPP newspaper.

CIP, Detroit, feels that this situation can be exploited by distribution of copies of the enclosed pamphlet or a pamphlet similar to it prepared by the Exhibits Section. This pamphlet could obviously originate in Detroit--and thereby point to [redacted]

[redacted] if other Chapters of the BPP are similarly disenchanting with the BPP newspaper program, it could be made to appear as though it originated in another city and sent to other Chapters, including Detroit.

Recent attempts were made in Milwaukee by the BPP to form a coalition of various radical groups under the name of People's Alliance (PA). Representatives from the BPP, CP, SDS, Brown Berets and other groups met in an attempt to establish a defense fund and provide legal counsel for members of the various organizations.

The Brown Berets (BB) subsequently pulled out of the PA because they refused to be associated with CP-inspired activities. They also expressed a general distrust for the SDS and BPP groups.

Nevertheless, numerous contacts by the BPP with representatives of the BB indicate the desire of the BPP to form a coalition between the groups but the BB remains hesitant to participate in any such agreement. They express a desire to remain separate in order to best accomplish the goals of the Spanish community without outside interference.

The PA has continued to weaken since the BB pullout. Milwaukee confidential sources indicate a growing rift between the SDS, the CP and the BPP. The BPP points out that its members have been anxious to cooperate and establish a successful coalition; however, the other groups have not done their part. SDS and the CP members have been accused of being all talk and no action. SDS members, on the other hand, have expressed a feeling of "intellectual superiority" over other groups and feel they should dictate policies and activities.

The BPP has shown a desire to be in the controlling position on the PA, as well as other rallies sponsored in conjunction with SDS at Milwaukee and Madison, Wis., while SDS appears to have the same idea. As a result, relations are becoming continually more strained between the two groups.

Obvious weaknesses are beginning to appear in the Wis. BPP organizations as a result of the above rifts, coupled with internal financial and leadership conflicts. Nevertheless, no info has been received of attempts to form a new organization made up of ex-BPP members.

It is recommended that BB, BPP and SDS informants be instructed to encourage distrust of one group for another and discourage cooperation among the groups at every opportunity. Primary targets should be the Latin American suspicion of all outside groups and the BPP lust for control of all coalitions and activities.

All Milwaukee sources have been alerted to the possible organization of a new black militant organization to replace the weakening BPP, and Bureau will be immediately advised of any such attempts.

It is felt that efforts to utilize for counter-intelligence value information emanating from [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] will prove unproductive. It is felt that to anonymously provide the information to clergy, businesses or educators in the black community would serve no end, as immorality, infidelity, and common-law marriages among the lower class Negroes are commonplace occurrences, perhaps to the extent of being the norm.

To disseminate such information within the BPP would be fruitless, as not only is there no stigma attached to sexual promiscuity, but it is expected and even honorable conduct for a true "revolutionary".

In the same regard, it would not be productive to apprise white sympathizers and supporters of the BPP of such conduct as, again, there is no stigma attached, and in all probability, they are both aware of it and/or indulge in similar activity to an equal degree.

Los Angeles will give further attention to the possibility of exploiting counterintelligence value of this information and if, in the future, an appropriate opportunity arises, it's usefulness will be maximized.

It is the only mosque in Mississippi, although there are two small NOI cells in Ocean Springs, Miss., and Meridian, Miss. Muhammed's Mosque, Jackson, Miss., holds general meetings on Sundays at 2:00 p.m. at the Farish Street Negro Y.M.C.A. where it rents a room. Guards are placed at all entrances to the room during the meeting.

It is proposed that the following letter, which would be handwritten by a senior steno in the Jackson Office, be forwarded to the Jackson Daily News with a bogus signature and no return address:

"Dear Jack Sunn,

"I have an uneducated adult relative by marriage who has told me very reluctantly that he began attending Nation of Islam 'Muslim Church' group meetings in the recent past held weekly at a building on Farish St. in Jackson. This relative says the all black group has several leaders who all are from outside Miss. originally and there seem to be 'more chiefs than Indians.' They demand \$6 or \$7 per week dues and preach segregation of races, give anti-white sermons, advocate that blacks avoid Army service and have guards posted at meetings. Due to the high 'donations' demanded and apparent suspicious goings on regarding meetings and funds collected he stopped attending

meetings. He was harassed, badgered and intimidated at his home and work by strong arm men associated with the group's leaders who tried to force him to pay dues and help in raising funds. After his repeated protests they finally left him alone. Is there anything that can be done to prevent these outsiders from preying on poor uneducated citizens in Jackson? I understand the group is still active in town.

"Signed: Mrs. Pearlina C. Rogers"

Immediately after the letter is mailed, [redacted] will be contacted by Jackson Agents and advised that Jackson sources have advised that a relative of a Muslim has forwarded some type of letter to JACK SUNN complaining about the Muslim activity in Jackson. At this time [redacted]

If this is agreeable with [redacted] the following answer would be provided to him after a day's delay to allegedly prepare answer:

"You should have your relative and anyone else known to be so treated to relate his experiences to local law enforcement agencies who will be especially interested in any force or extortion methods used to coerce persons to work or to pay 'dues' or 'donations' against their will; also reputable community leaders in the area should be advised about operations of this nature so that they can educate unsuspecting persons in advance."

The ultimate result would be that the letter and the answer would be published prominently in a "Ask Jack Sunn" column. (Only initials of letter contributors are published.)

V. Objective

The objective of the above letter would be to reflect the NOI mosque in Jackson and its leadership in an unfavorable light and to alert the community to the existence of a NOI group in the Jackson area; additionally it could have an effect on Muslim recruiting and fund-raising activities in the Jackson area.

VI. Recommendation

The Jackson Division feels that the above proposal can be accomplished without any danger to Jackson sources due to the unspecific nature of the contents of the letter and the fact that it is written by a person allegedly not directly associated with the NOI.

PROBLEMS IN BROADCASTING

Dear Jack Sunn:

We have AM and FM radio in Jackson. AM broadcasts are continuously (and jerkily) being interrupted by commercial "messages" which, we understand, pay the rent, salaries, dividends, etc. of the broadcasting facility. On the other hand, FM is not so often interrupted with these "messages." Is this because of FCC regulations, lack of interest by advertisers, tax write-off or (gasp) altruism? You're glad I answered this question aren't you? Also, we have noted that Houston, Texas, which can never, by any stretch of the imagination, be considered a modern Athens, culture-wise, has one FM station that programs nothing but serious music an occasional "scholarly" jazz program, news and comment. We speculate whether one adventurous local-FM station might not please a considerable segment of the public by trying something similar.

The FCC does not regulate the number of commercial announcements on FM, per se. Yes, there is less interest by advertisers in FM broadcasting because there are fewer FM sets than AM (the big difference being in automobile penetration), therefore there are fewer listeners. There ain't hardly no altruism in the broadcasting industry. Competition is too tough, especially in markets the size of ours. We like to think of the Jackson market as being more "couth" than some other areas of this size, but a look at relatively small membership lists of the Symphony Orchestra, the Music Association and the Opera Guild should give us pause for reflection. Two of these groups have to be heavily subsidized by "angels." Operating an FM station in a market our size is indeed adventurous, financially at least. Add to that, a "cultural" format, and the manager wishes he could skip the board meetings! Let's see—what was the question?—yes, we wish there was a classical music FM station here but we wouldn't want to own it. That is, if we were trying to make money. And if it's any comfort to you, the ROCK FM stations aren't doing much better.

STADIUM NEIGHBORHOOD PARKING

Dear Jack Sunn:

First, I would like to say I appreciate your column in the Jackson Daily News as some of the things you say are really good for my State Capital. So, here I come. I am asking this for several reasons. Every time I go to a sporting event at the Memorial Stadium I have to pay \$1.00 to park on property the taxpayer is already paying for each year. Where does the money go?—if we have to pay for it, how is it the State Highway Department Office put up a chain behind their office and let in State employes only without a charge? The State employes can afford to pay for parking as well as the rest of the people. Who says what and when and how about this? S. S. S.

1. We have been told that when the Memorial Stadium was built, money was not provided for parking facilities and the upkeep of same. The revenue from parking charges is used for manning the lots when events are held, for surfacing new areas and the preparing and extending of old portions of the parking area.
2. We presume you are referring to the area behind the State Highway Department Laboratory on the northeast corner of North West and Woodrow Wilson. The Highway Department tells us that their parking area became unmanageable during sporting events at the Stadium, as the Stadium Commission had no jurisdiction over it and therefore could not charge for parking there, and the Highway Department could obviously make no charges for the use of state owned land. As a result, parking permission tickets were issued to Highway Department employes on a first come, first serve basis.

Exhaustive interviews of suspected members of the LABPP continue and are serving to create distrust among activists and the defection of peripheral members.

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

The proposal suggested in referenced Los Angeles letter dated 9/24/69, is being forwarded in a separate communication. Per Bureau instructions in reference Bureau letter dated 10/9/69, further consideration is being given documents mentioned and a proposal will be forthcoming.

A survey of toll calls of selected LABPP leaders continues, with the result of these reviews being considered for counterintelligence proposals.

The Los Angeles Division continues to follow arrests of members of the LABPP for violations of Anti-Riot and Gun Control laws, to determine if any of these individuals might

With regard to the San Francisco Division's preparation of expulsion letters to be directed to individual members of the BPP not in close contact with the BPP National Headquarters, Berkeley, California; in order to produce disruption and defection from the national membership, it is felt that due to Los Angeles' geographical proximity to San Francisco, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and the minimal distance and continuous contact between the separate sections of the Los Angeles BPP, the effort may prove unsuccessful. It is felt that due to the extensive communications between the local Los Angeles BPP sections, the spontaneous expulsion, without forewarning, in the form of suspension, rumor of current disfavor or explanation, of members of the Los Angeles BPP, especially if in significant numbers, might promptly come to the attention of local leaders who could readily investigate and confirm the legitimacy of action allegedly taken. Should the effort fail to produce the desired results, it is felt that the failure could well result in increased suspicion or compromise of the use of letters over the signatures of BPP leaders, or anonymous letters in general, as a counterintelligence tool.

In compliance with San Francisco's request if Bureau approval is obtained, Los Angeles will attempt to prepare a highly selective list of individuals who are considered to be peripheral members of the party, and who have minimal contact with active members and leaders.

[REDACTED] was referred by Agents of the Jackson FBI Office to Associated Press Release of 3/29/69, regarding [REDACTED] and his releasing numerous members of the Republic of New Africa (RNA) in Detroit, Michigan, after some of them were involved in a shoot out with police officers, during which one policeman was killed. [REDACTED] as also referred to an article in a recent issue of Ebony (which had been provided to Jackson Agents by a Ghetto informant), which also contained information regarding Judge CROCKETT and his involvement with the RNA in Detroit.

[REDACTED] CROCKETT since he was appearing at Tougaloo College, which had been the scene of past extremist agitation in Mississippi. Tougaloo College is an almost entirely Negro private college of about seven hundred students, located five miles north of Jackson, Miss., in a rural area. It has been a staging area for Civil Rights and extremist Negro activities since the early 1960's.

The Jackson Daily News is the only statewide evening paper distributed throughout Mississippi, and it has the largest reading audience of any evening newspaper in the State of Mississippi.

Tougaloo Speaker Is Judge Who Has Detroit In Uproar

Tougaloo College, heavily endowed by wealthy liberals and fat, tax-exempt foundation funds, doesn't spend much money on its physical facilities, but it offers scholarships to students from various parts of the world as well as in this area. Apparently, it spends considerable money to import speakers—some of whom are rather controversial.

The predominately black institution just north of Jackson earlier this year hosted Herbert Aptheker, one of the top drawer Communists in the nation who recently held the rank of theoretician of the Communist Party United States of America, as a featured speaker, but he didn't make a great impression on the students and visitors. At least on the surface.

Whether there was any connection with Aptheker's visit or not, a few weeks later there was a sort of secret pow-wow at Tougaloo. It was a "closed society" meeting for radical-minded blacks only, the sort of huddle that liberals and advocates of "academic freedom" allegedly despise.

In the current issue (October) issue of the Reader's Digest in an article entitled "Intelligence Report on Today's New Revolutionaries" by William Schulz, it is reported briefly on page 121 what took place at similar closed session in recent past:

"At Tougaloo College in Mississippi, students from Negro colleges in the South and East attend a closed-door 'defense workshop', discuss the elimination of mayors and police chiefs, the kidnaping of college authorities, the instruction of ghetto residents in the manufacture of Molotov cocktails and use of firearms."

So much for the Reader's Digest article (and it's excellent reading).

With a short of publicity flourish, Tougaloo College has announced that its key speaker for its Founders' Day convocation at 3 p. m. next Sunday, Oct. 12 will be Detroit Judge George W. Crockett, Jr. The news report on Judge Crockett gave an impressive list of education credentials, service with the National Youth Administration in Washington in the late thirties, as an attorney with the U.S. Department of Labor and as an executive in the labor movement when he moved to Detroit in 1944 where he has been active in civic and political affairs.

But Judge Crockett has been making the headlines in Detroit for some time, recently as a sort of judicial friend of black people in general and in one specific case a most generous judge in a riot involving a cop-killing group of rifle-carrying members of the Republic of New Africa, the extremist group that has declared independence from the United States and wants to set up a black nation in five Southern states, including, and starting with, of course, Mississippi.

A glowing article in a recent issue of Ebony magazine also states that Judge Crockett was the man who held "Operation Mississippi" meetings in his home in Detroit, came to Mississippi in 1964 as a legal assistance chief in the freedom rider episode.

Ebony reported: "It was he (Crockett) who asked Michael Schwerner, Andrew Goodman and James Chaney to go to Philadelphia, Miss., to check out the burning of a black church. They were lynched and buried in an earthen dam, and Mississippi brutality was brought once again to the attention of the world."

In a lengthy and glowing article about Judge Crockett and his swift decree freeing the cop-killing Black Republic extremists, Ebony quotes Judge Crockett: "I'm a black judge and I never allow myself to forget that fact."

So much for the Ebony article.

Detroit newspapers have deplored the racist attitude of Judge Crockett, his peering accusations of police officers and his super-liberal attitude toward those who run afoul of the law, including murder.

The Associated Press reported out of Detroit a riot on Saturday, March 29, eve of Palm Sunday. A sizeable group of rifle-carrying members of the Republic of New Africa had ended a "closed society" pow-wow at a church. After the meeting some of the fellows were seen on the street with rifles and other armaments. Police went to investigate and the group opened fire, killing one officer Michael Czapski. Several other participants were injured.

Police arrested 135 persons and began making nitrate tests to determine if their guns had been fired. Judge Crockett heard about these tests and ordered all but eight of those arrested free while Officer Czapski's body, with seven holes in his chest, was being hauled from the murder scene.

Additionally, Judge Crockett cited Williams L. Cahalan, Wayne County prosecutor, for contempt for his insistence in an investigation of the incident, for it had been found that nitrate tests revealed the guns had been fired recently. In citing Cahalan for contempt, Judge Crockett released the remaining eight and said the tests were unconstitutional because they were conducted before the accused had a chance to consult an attorney. Meanwhile, funeral rites were being planned for the slain policeman.

This report is merely to fill out a few gaps in advance publicity on Judge Crockett's convocation engagement at Tougaloo.

There may be absolutely no connection with the secret meeting of advocates of the ilk of the Republic of New Africa held earlier at Tougaloo, but the honored speaker next Sunday is rated as a benefactor of this element in connection with the brutal death of a Detroit policeman on the eve of Palm Sunday this year.

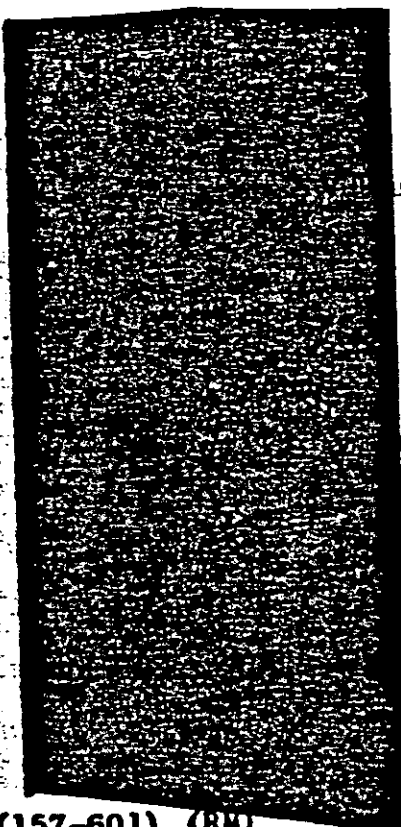

In connection with the demand made by the Black United Front (BUF) that the New Mobilization Committee to End the War (NMC) pay BUF \$25,000 for its assistance in the NMC rally scheduled for Washington on 11/15/69, [redacted] that at a BUF committee meeting a letter from NMC was read. This letter stated that the NMC will not meet BUF's demand for \$25,000 but is willing to hold a joint fund raising benefit of some kind.

Since the NMC letter has been made public to BUF members, WFO suggests that it is an appropriate time for the press release captioned "Member of BUF Expresses Shock at Hobson Stand" to be provided to press sources friendly to the Bureau, if the Bureau so desires.

By letters and letterhead memoranda dated 10/7/69 and captioned "BLACK UNITED FRONT, RM", WFO reported an incident which occurred at the Black United Front (BUF) meeting held on 10/1/69. The incident involved an individual identified as [redacted] accompanied by two individuals subsequently identified as [redacted] and [redacted] taking over the meeting in order for [redacted] to have an opportunity to present his side of a disagreement he was having with [redacted]. During the incident, [redacted] discharged a gun inside of the church in which the meeting was held and accused [redacted] who was conducting the meeting, of fire bombing an automobile that he [redacted] had been using but which was not his. The three individuals were subsequently [redacted] being charged with assault with a deadly weapon and the others being charged with carrying deadly weapons, to wit machetes.

To date WFO has not observed any WDC newspaper reporting the incident or arrests of the individuals. WFO believes that publicizing the above incident would cause considerable embarrassment to the BUF and might possibly cause some individuals to stay away from future BUF meetings when they become aware that such activity has taken place at meetings in the past.

1. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) Breakfast for Children Program, which is being organized by [redacted] a BPP member transferred to New Haven from Boston, is being carefully watched for opportunities for counterintelligence action. [redacted] attitude toward New Haven merchants to date, however, has caused a certain amount of resentment and a feeling that the BPP is "shaking down" the merchants. The [redacted]

[redacted] The New Haven Division is following this program with the possibility of a possible federal extortion violation.

2. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED.

As authorized by the Bureau, New Haven will continue to furnish public source data to approved press representatives. New Haven will remain alert for those incidents or circumstances which may lend themselves to counterintelligence exploitation.

The New Haven Division is pursuing those investigations which will lead to successful prosecution of BPP members and leadership at the Federal or local level.

Other members of AIM appeared as though they were going to defend their fellow member and the BPP members in attendance made a move to defend the SDS leader. The incident resulted in a stand-off.

Re Denver letter of 9/15/69.

Information has been received from Denver informants and San Francisco highly confidential informants that the Denver group of the Black Panther Party (BPP) is practically bankrupt and is in desperate need of funds. The only available funds are what they receive from the sale of the BPP newspaper, the circulation of which has dropped in Denver. The San Francisco Office advised Denver that even paying a \$50 bond because of the arrest of [redacted] in Denver was of great concern to the Denver finances.

It is suggested that [redacted] without jeopardizing himself, immediately advise and help assist BPP members in Denver into committing minor offenses such as traffic violations where fines would have to be paid. Denver will immediately notify the Police Department in order for citations to be issued.

Because of the timing involved it would be impossible to request Bureau authority on each occasion of a minor offense. If this technique is agreeable to the Bureau, Denver requests that action be taken immediately by this office without notifying the Bureau of each violation that may occur.

This is to recommend the attached mass media item be furnished to a cooperative news media source on a confidential basis. The item relates information concerning the presence in the United States at this time of Miriam Makeba, the wife of black extremist Stokely Carmichael, who currently is residing in Africa.

It is felt this item might provide the basis for an exclusive interview of Makeba, whose presence in the United States to this time, to our knowledge, has not been reported by the American press. Such an interview could be utilized to our advantage in disclosing Makeba's presence in the country and could also be utilized as an entree to the development of pertinent information with respect to Carmichael and his current activities.

It should be noted that, as set forth in the attached, Makeba was utilized by Carmichael for issuance of a public announcement of his resignation from the Black Panther Party in July, 1969.

Information concerning Makeba's presence in the United States [REDACTED] and the release of information contained in the attached will not jeopardize that source.

Stokely Carmichael is a well-known black extremist who formerly served as National Chairman of the Student Non-violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), currently known as the Student National Coordinating Committee. He left SNCC in August, 1968, and became Prime Minister of the violence-prone Black Panther Party (BPP).

Carmichael and his wife, well-known African folk singer Miriam Makeba, left the United States in December, 1968, and currently make their residence in Conakry, Guinea.

In late June, 1969, Miriam Makeba returned to the United States alone, reportedly for the purpose of arranging future professional appearances in the United States. On July 3, 1969, just prior to her departure to rejoin Carmichael in Guinea, she announced his resignation from the BPP because of his disagreement with that organization's change in policy in accepting and enlisting support from radical white individuals and organizations.

Makeba recently returned to the United States and is residing at the residence of Carmichael's mother, 1810 Amethyst Avenue, Bronx, New York. She anticipates remaining in the United States until November, 1969, and is engaged in arranging a number of professional appearances while here.

According to the file, [REDACTED] had been originally declared delinquent by LB #32 on 6/20/68, when he failed to report for May, 1968, induction. Following correspondence with LB #32, Roxbury, indicating his failure to report not willful [REDACTED] was re-ordered for induction as of 8/20/68. On this date he reported for a physical examination at the Boston Army Base at which time he was rejected for the following reasons:

Deformed left ankle; visual defects;
drugs; homosexuality

The physical examination form signed by [REDACTED] Medical Corps, US Navy Reserve, contains the further comment "is an overt homosexual."

[REDACTED] was subsequently reclassified 4-F based on the aforementioned physical examination and continues to be in a 4-F status.

The fact that [REDACTED] was believed to be a homosexual has previously been furnished to racial informants of the Boston Division without revealing the source of this information. They have been encouraged to pass along this information at opportune times to other members of the BPP and black extremists in Boston in order to undermine [REDACTED] status with the BPP.

In view of the confidential nature of the records of the Selective Service System, Boston is unable to recommend any further special counter-intelligence proposals by which this information concerning [REDACTED] homosexuality could be utilized.

Since [REDACTED] is currently assigned in the New Haven Division on a temporary basis as a BPP organizer, New Haven is requested to also consider all possible opportunities where this information could be utilized. As stated in referenced Bureau letter, however, no action should be taken without specific Bureau approval.

I. OPERATIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION

The BPP in San Diego is being forced to move from their headquarters, 2952 Imperial, due to being \$400 in arrears in rent. Informants advise the BPP leadership is considering renting a house at 311 Boundary in San Diego. Attempts are being made to determine the owner of this property. Depending upon the identity of the owner, Bureau authority may be requested to attempt to block the renting of this house by the BPP.

Informants report that [redacted], a BPP member, receives approximately \$178 per month from the Welfare Department. BPP headquarters in Oakland has reportedly demanded that the entire check be forwarded to BPP headquarters. [redacted] explained to headquarters that she and [redacted] were married and have a small child to support. The BPP then directed [redacted] to send \$74 of her check to BPP headquarters each month.

This situation is being carefully scrutinized to determine if any counterintelligence action can be utilized without jeopardizing the security of any informant. If this can be accomplished, appropriate requests will be submitted for Bureau evaluation.

II. OPERATIONS BEING EFFECTED

Bureau approved anonymous telephone calls were placed on 9/16, 22, and 24/69, to [REDACTED] protesting the activities of [REDACTED] and the attempted furtherance of the BPP Breakfast Program by [REDACTED]. During the telephone conversations with [REDACTED] he appeared quite concerned over the situation in that parish, and stated that he was looking into it.

In addition, on 9/18/69, the letter as outlined in San Diego airtel to the Bureau 8/29/69, and approved in Bureau letter to San Diego 9/9/69, was mailed to [REDACTED].

For tangible results observed in this regard, see the following section of this letter.

Bureau approved information was furnished to [REDACTED] Representative of Governor REAGAN's office, regarding use of the Black Student Council (BSC) office at San Diego State College (SDSC) by the US organization in obtaining supplies and utilization of the mimeograph machine. [REDACTED] is presently attempting to determine if any school financial sources are being used for purchase of supplies and operation of the mimeograph machine in the BSC office at the college. If school funds are being utilized to support the BSC at SDSC, [REDACTED] will so advise the Governor and recommend that appropriate action be taken to preclude the continued use of those facilities by a black militant group.

The Bureau approved letter to [REDACTED] is being prepared on commercially purchased stationery, incorporating the changes pointed out in referenced Bureau letter to San Diego 9/17/69.

Bureau approved information regarding the incorporation of US, Incorporated, has been furnished to

[REDACTED] is presently attempting to determine whether or not a Form 1120 has been submitted by that organization as required by law. Upon determination of this fact, the Bureau will be contacted for any further action which appears logical.

III. TANGIBLE RESULTS

On 10/1/69, a pretext telephone call was placed to the rectory of [REDACTED] at which time [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] was no longer at that parish and had been permanently transferred to the San Francisco Bay Area.

In addition, [REDACTED] who has a close friend in the chancery office, advised that [REDACTED] has been transferred to a "rehabilitation center" for appropriate counselling after which he will be transferred to a location somewhere in the State of New Mexico for permanent assignment. This information was volunteered when a routine inquiry was made at the Police Department concerning what, if any, current activities [REDACTED] was engaged in.

In view of the above, it would appear that [REDACTED] has now been completely neutralized.

The BPP Breakfast Program, without the prompting of [REDACTED] has not been renewed in the San Diego area. It is not anticipated at this time that any efforts to re-establish the program will be made in the foreseeable future.

[REDACTED] on 9/25/69, reported that the parishioners of [REDACTED] participated in a vote and solidly defeated a proposal to reinstitute the BPP Breakfast Program.

IV.

DEVELOPMENTS OF COUNTERINTELLIGENCE INTEREST

[REDACTED] both of whom are believed to be underground members of the BPP, have been declared "pigs" by the BPP office in Los Angeles. As a result, both of these individuals have fled from the San Diego area, are in hiding, and their whereabouts are unknown.

At the present time, nine of the sixteen active BPP members in the San Diego area are in custody on various charges.

[REDACTED] has reportedly fled from the San Diego area due to extensive efforts by the [REDACTED] on information furnished by the San Diego FBI office to effect his arrest. The latest information concerning [REDACTED] whereabouts reveals that he is believed to be hiding out in the area immediately north of the San Francisco Bay Area. It was not possible to cause [REDACTED] arrest while he was in the San Diego area as to do so would have [REDACTED]
