Field Day pairs Soldiers with 'Exceptional' youths

More than 60 Exceptional Family Member Program and Italian participants, 60 Caserma Ederle Soldiers and 190 volunteers took part in one of the biggest community events of the year May 12. The EFMP Field Day was a chance for EFMP and Italian youth with special needs to participate in competitive games and events such as soccer, volleyball and track, plus arts and crafts.

Each participant was paired with an "Airborne Buddy" to compete in the events and was guided throughout the day by volunteer group leaders and assistants. Recognizable by their bright yellow EFMP T-shirts, numerous volunteers fluent in both Italian and English were present and acted as interpreters for all participants facilitating communication.

"The EFMP Field Day was such a great experience," said Bailey Butler, volunteer group leader. "We all got to bond with the kids and the Soldiers and come together as a community. I was a group leader which called for a lot of responsibility that surprised me in the beginning, but ended up being the best part of the day."

As the groups of five to seven participants completed each activity station, ribbons and medals were given out, boosting morale to the sounds of "YMCA" and "Waka Waka." After having completed the events and sharing a meal together, all participants were able to enjoy a military police canine demonstration and a final relay event, the conclusion of the events.

"I thought the day was a great chance to get out there and rub shoulders with the community and demonstrate that we care," said Spc. Kenneth Mitchell, geospatial engineer, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 173rd Airborne Brigade Combat Team. Mitchell helped with sporting events, but felt that even having snacks was a great

Fast actions credited with saving life at post soccer tourney

Emergency situations happen in a matter of minutes and the steps taken are extremely critical. When an emergency occurred on Caserma Ederle May 7, instincts and training helped several individuals jump to action and save a life.

A soccer tournament was being played on the North 40 football field, when Ricky Jackson, sports programmer for the Fitness Center, heard yelling from the end of the field.

"I just took off towards the commotion," Jackson said.

When he got there, a 39-year-old Italian man was lying on the field with no pulse. Two individuals had started CPR on the man. Jackson started to run across the street toward the Fitness Center, where Marcus Nielsen, a Caserma Ederle firefighter, happened to be leaving the center. Jackson asked for his assistance while calling for an ambulance.

When the two returned to the scene, they relieved the fellow soccer players, Daniele Gasparin and Bax Fioravante, who had started CPR when the player went down. According to Nielsen, the initial CPR was critical to helping bring the man back to life.

"When I got to the scene, CPR was being administered by two local nationals (Gasparin and Fioravante) and (Firefighter Scott)

Williams showed up with the (Automated External Defibrillator)," Nielsen said.

Nielsen used the defibrillator to shock the man's heart and then performed chest compressions, while Williams performed ventilations. The victim started breathing and a pulse was felt by the rescuers. Both Williams, who is an assistant chief, and Nielsen are trained as EMTs. Jackson had only taken a CPR class a few months ago and had never used the training. Jackson said Mary Bean, a nurse from the Health Clinic who was on the scene, not only performed CPR, but helped with the count to keep the rhythm going.

"This was truly a team effort," Jackson said. "Everyone stayed very calm and didn't panic. If you take any piece out of this equation, that man wouldn't be here today."

Joe Reeder, who taught Jackson CPR said, "It is very rewarding for me to know that students from class can apply the skills they learn and save a life."

According to witnesses, when the man became conscious he said, "Thank you" to the people helping him. The victim was transported by ambulance to San Bortolo hospital and kept under observation.

Reeder will be teaching a CPR class June 11 at Army Community Service, building 108. To sign up for the class contact the American Red Cross at 634-7089 or stop by the office.

Vicenza Middle School was the setting for the first "mini" Junior Leadership Seminar April 30. The 24 students from the sixth, seventh and eighth grades were chosen from 50 applications for this event. The mini JLS is the brainchild of Information Center coordinator, Tere Taylor. Taylor wanted to introduce the students to what the annual Department of Defense Dependant Schools-Europe JLS in Germany is like by creating a "mini" version in Vicenza.

The students were divided into four teams — blue, red, yellow, and brown — competing in categories such "Name That Leader," "Human Knot," "Catch a Name" and "Balloon Relay." Highlights of the seminar included presentations about the Four Pillars of Leadership, Characteristics of a Leader, Building a Model Leader, Communication Skills, Introduction to the Art of Debate, Reaching Consensus, Parliamentary Procedures, Technology Tips and the Dance Revolution. The seminar included an overnight "Leadership Lock-in" at VMS and a study trip the following morning to the ropes course in Asiago. The ropes course is designed to help build teamwork as well as leadership skills.

'Rock' Soldiers participate in public service for the city of Caldogno

Reaching out to several towns that surround Caserma Ederle, Soldiers from the 1st Battalion, 503rd Infantry Regiment, 173rd Airborne Brigade Combat Team, under the leadership of Lt. Col. Matthew McFarlane, battalion commander, recently worked on a public service project in the City of Caldogno.

"I am particularly pleased with the bonds of friendship and cooperation that we have established with the citizens of Caldogno," said Daiga, "because our Soldiers and families will integrate into the Caldogno community in a direct and personal fashion."


