The United States Coast Guard Multicultural, Diversity and Inclusion Calendar for 2012 was developed by the Office of Diversity and the Civil Rights Directorate as an education and training tool to enhance mutual understanding and respect among the various religious, ethnic and cultural groups. This calendar is about honoring our differences and increasing awareness of the numerous important national and international observances and celebrations that may be commemorated in the United States. Acknowledging and respecting these events promotes greater knowledge of multiculturalism and diversity and is a foundation to inclusion. Realizing diversity requires the creation of an inclusive work environment that respects and values the differences that each service member and employee brings to the Coast Guard.
