Dear Mr. Acting Chairman:

This letter constitutes the first report to Congress mandated in section 103 of the Weapons System Acquisition Reform Act of 2009, Pub. L. No. 111-23, which requires the senior official for the Office of Program Assessment and Root Cause Analysis (PARCA) submit to the congressional defense committees a report on the activities undertaken under this section during the preceding year.

Mr. Gary Bliss was appointed the first director of the PARCA office by a DepSecDef memorandum on January 4, 2010. PARCA reports to the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Acquisition) (ASD(A)), within the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics, OUSD (AT&L).

Standing up an office does not occur instantaneously, and PARCA is no different. The Army agreed to supply a Colonel as Military Deputy for the office and he has been serving since September, along with one contractor. This staff was available when the office was established in January 2010. The first action is the designation and acquisition of the directors required for the two statutorily mandated functions of PARCA: the Performance Assessment Director and the Root Cause Director. Two highly qualified candidates with deep backgrounds and experience in the field have agreed to accept the challenge, and we expect them to be on the on the staff by April 2010. Further, as of this writing (mid-February), over \$2 million of FY 2010 monies have been identified for PARCA's immediate use this spring. Finally, the President's FY 2011 Budget Request to Congress identified resources in the FY 2011 request as well as programming for FY 2012 and beyond.

In closing, while establishing PARCA in the past few months, the office has been very clear with all the DoD stakeholders as to what PARCA will and will not be addressing. PARCA will provide timely objective assessments of program execution and highlight lessons learned from root cause analyses. In so doing, the office views its function as purely descriptive: it measures what has happened, and, in the event of problems, offers even-handed, disinterested, assessments of the problem's sources and how it may be avoided in the future. Otherwise, PARCA will not be involved in decision-making, nor as an advocate for any particular course of action. By keeping a disinterested perspective, PARCA's judgments can be seen as useful and constructive.

This letter is being provided to the Chairmen and Ranking Members of the other congressional defense committees.
