DETAILS:

This investigation was predicated upon receipt of information from Detective [REDACTED] Henrico County, Virginia Police Department, who advised that he had received information from [REDACTED] the Towne Motel, Route 1, North, Richmond, Virginia, that two suspicious Negro males had rented Rooms 2 and 4 at the motel and were using a Virginia rental car bearing Virginia license RAS-340.

[redacted] was interviewed at Room 2, Towne Motel, Route 1 North, Richmond, Virginia by Special Agents [redacted] and [redacted].

At the outset of the interview, [redacted] was advised of the Agents' identities by Special Agent [redacted] and Special Agent [redacted] also indicated to [redacted] that the Agents desired to talk to him concerning his activities in Richmond.

[redacted] asked why the FBI was interested in him, and he was advised by Special Agent [redacted] that there have been numerous bank robberies in that part of Richmond perpetrated by Negro males utilizing rental cars with Virginia license plates and who stayed at motels on the day before the robbery.

[redacted] stated he has never been involved in any bank robbery, nor is he planning any, and he voluntarily consented to being interviewed by the Agents. b7C

[redacted] stated he has been in Richmond for approximately a week since flying in from Los Angeles, California.

[redacted] was asked by Special Agent [redacted] if he remembered the exact date and airline, and he stated he could not remember.

[redacted] stated he does not know anyone in Richmond, but he is merely traveling and visiting the city in general. [redacted] stated he is unemployed.

[redacted] furnished identification via a California Driver's License, number [redacted], which shows his home address as being [redacted], Los Angeles, California, and which described [redacted] as follows:

At this point in the interview, [REDACTED] was asked by Special Agent [REDACTED] for the protection of all in the room if [REDACTED] had a gun in the room. [REDACTED] stated that he did and pointed to a dresser drawer and stated he had a pistol in there. This weapon was recovered by Special Agent [REDACTED] and determined to be an unloaded Colt nickel-plated police positive .38 caliber revolver with a four-inch barrel, bearing Serial Number 82588.

The revolver was maintained by Special Agent [REDACTED] for the remainder of the interview.

[REDACTED] was asked if any dope or bank robbery loot was being kept in the room, and he stated that there was none.

[REDACTED] was asked by Special Agent [REDACTED] if he had any convictions and had done any jail time, and [REDACTED] stated he was sentenced several years ago to one year in the Los Angeles County Jail and two years summary probation for an assault charge in which he shot a man. He indicated he served approximately nine months and was released on May 14 of either 1972 or 1973.

[REDACTED] was asked by Special Agent [REDACTED] about a white Pinto with rental tags parked in front of the motel, and [REDACTED] vehemently denied having anything to do with that Pinto.

Special Agent [REDACTED] noted to [REDACTED] that there was a considerable quantity of luggage in the corner of the room and this obviously included a relatively new typewriter. [REDACTED] was asked by Special Agent [REDACTED] if this was all his property, and he stated that the typewriter was not his as it was in the room when he moved in.

Special Agent [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if a brown briefcase on the floor next to the bed was his, and [REDACTED] stated that that also was in the room when he moved in. b7c

Special Agent [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if this property was, therefore, abandoned property, and [REDACTED] stated that he presumed so. Special Agent [REDACTED] stated that the Agents would examine it as abandoned property and [REDACTED] agreed.

The briefcase was locked and forced open by Special Agent [REDACTED] and inside was a Paymaster Checkwriter and what appeared to be several hundred credit cards, blank checks, driver's licenses and other forms of identification.

[REDACTED] was shown the contents of the case, and he stated he had never seen any of these items before.

The interview of [REDACTED] was temporarily terminated, and [REDACTED] was detained by Special Agent [REDACTED] b7c

Approximately one-half hour later, Special Agent [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that he desired to have [REDACTED] voluntarily pose for photographs and give his fingerprints to determine his true identity. [REDACTED] asked if he had to submit his fingerprints and submit to being photographed, and he was told by Special Agent [REDACTED] that he did not. [REDACTED] stated he would voluntarily do so, and he was then photographed and fingerprinted.

The interview was temporarily terminated, and [REDACTED] was detained by Special Agent [REDACTED]

Approximately ten minutes later, [REDACTED] was advised by Special Agent [REDACTED] that he was being placed under arrest for violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 2315, which is receiving paraphernalia used in manufacturing fraudulent and stolen securities which have traveled in interstate commerce. b7c

[REDACTED] was thereafter transported to the Richmond FBI Office, where he was major case fingerprinted. At the time of his arrest, a pocket knife was removed from his pocket and retained. The belongings of [REDACTED] which consisted of two airline-type bags, one briefcase, and three cloth zipper-type garment bags, were brought to the Richmond FBI Office to be examined and impounded as possible evidence.

Richmond is submitting above-listed items to the FBI Laboratory for examination due to the fact that these documents were utilized by one or two unknown Caucasian females who are believed to be confederates of [REDACTED] who was arrested by Bureau Agents at the Town Motel, Richmond, Va., on 10/16/74, and charged with an ITSP violation for the possession of paraphernalia transported interstate to perpetrate an ITSP-type fraud and who, in addition, had hundreds of pieces of fraudulent identification, stolen credit cards and stolen checks in his possession.

UNSUB, white female, who has been identified through photographs found in the luggage of [REDACTED] as being identical with the UNSUB female in these photographs, was responsible for cashing above-listed checks and opening above-listed checking accounts at various Richmond banks. UNSUB female was also identified through same photograph as being the individual who rented a vehicle in Richmond, Va., and signed the name [REDACTED]

No Subjects have been positively identified, but the identification of [REDACTED] has been used in Vallejo, California to open an account using a Western States Food Industry employee's pension fund check. Teller description of [REDACTED] fits that of Unsub [REDACTED]

Contact with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] AAA Brass Foundry, determined that enclosed checks and AAA checks recovered by Richmond were taken from the company office by unknown individuals. There was no forced entry of AAA Foundry Offices, and it was not discovered that any checks were missing until the September bank statement was reconciled during early October, 1974. Missing checks were reported to the Bank of America who took appropriate action.

[REDACTED], Investigator, BankAmericard, 1 South Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, advised that he believed from his investigation that BankAmericard number [REDACTED] had been intercepted from the U.S. Mail. His explanation was that the bank had mailed the card to the prior address of [REDACTED], who was the proper recipient. Investigation by Postal Authorities had recovered numerous items taken from the U.S. Mails in the Oakland, San Leandro, California area. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he believed the above card could possibly have been taken by the group involved, but he had no positive information regarding the above card. Arrested by the Postal Authorities was a Caucasian female representing herself as [REDACTED]. Investigation determined that [REDACTED] true name was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] date of birth [REDACTED] Last address given as [REDACTED], Oakland, California.

Postal Inspector [REDACTED] confirmed that he had interviewed [REDACTED] regarding false identification and theft from U.S. Mails and that he had obtained her photograph and fingerprints. Due to an illegal search that obtained items stolen from the mails, the Postal Authorities were unable to obtain prosecution. Inspector [REDACTED] stated that the boyfriend of [REDACTED] was [REDACTED], a Negro male, last residing at [REDACTED] Richmond, California.

b7C For the information of Richmond, the photograph of [REDACTED] bears a marked resemblance to Unsub [REDACTED]. Investigation by San Francisco will be reported to Richmond in appropriate FD-302s, but to date extensive investigation has developed no positive information that would assist in identifying Unsubs. This investigation is being coordinated with Bank of America Security and the Crocker National Bank, both organizations have sustained considerable losses from individuals operating in an identical manner to Unsubs. Also, teller description closely resembles Unsub Caucasian female. This investigation will be expeditiously reported to Richmond.

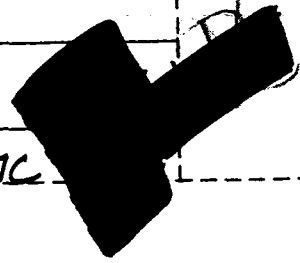
