Women in Science Hall of Fame: We have now featured all of the inaugural 2010 class of the NEA Women in Science Hall of Fame Honorees in our Hub Activities Reports and are soliciting the 2011 group of outstanding women scientists. Mobile Science Van Project: The ESTH Hub is collaborating with the Public Diplomacy Section at the Embassy in Amman to bring science to middle school students in Jordan! To complement the Embassy's two existing American Corners, a mobile science van will travel with displays and science experiments to rural schools in Northern Jordan. The Embassy is partnering with local and U.S. organizations to implement this project. As our main partner, we selected the Princess Basma Youth Resource Center

(http://www.johud.org.jo/Youth.html), which has expertise in promoting the role of youth in society through its 50 youth development centers throughout Jordan. We will train science students from the Jordan University of Science and Technology to help the children conduct science experiments. Embassy Amman hosted Dr. Crystal Harden, Director of the Traveling Science Learning Program at the University of North Carolina's Morehead Planetarium and Science Center, who conducted a number of discussions and workshops on pedagogy, research methods, and informal science teaching, as well as science activities and experiments at youth centers in July. Dr. Harden assisted in selecting a number of students from different scientific disciplines at the Jordan University for Science and Technology as the core group to carry out the outreach activities when the science van is operational.

GULF - Art Exhibition to Showcase Arabia's Wild Side: A large coalition of conservation groups have teamed up with National Geographic Al Arabiya to launch a massive outdoor art exhibition to tackle people's perceptions and showcase a wide variety of species from the Arabian Peninsula. It is hoped that the exhibition will raise awareness of the region's biodiversity and also encourage a culture of conservation amongst citizens in the Gulf nations. The world premier exhibition will take place in the Abu Dhabi Corniche in December 2011 and will then head to Dubai before travelling internationally over the next couple of years.

JORDAN - University Students Plan to Make Good Use of an Abandoned Mass Transit Lane: A group of university students from Jordanian universities came up with a creative way to make use of a halted major project in the middle of Amman. The Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project was suspended and funding was cut due to a corruption case a few months back. The project is on the route of a major traffic street leading to four universities. Students launched a campaign called "Get your bike and follow me," and are encouraging their fellow students to use bikes instead of regular means of transportation. JORDAN – Green Peace Organizes the 5th Anti-Nuclear Protest: On August 16, Green Peace Jordan and *Irhamouna* (have mercy on us) campaign organized a sit-in in front of Mafraq Municipality near Majdal, the site of the planned Jordanian nuclear program. Now that Jordan is months away from announcing the winning bidder to construct the country's first nuclear reactor, anti-nuclear activists vowed to step up their protest activities. The Jordan Atomic Energy Commission (JAEC) is currently vetting offers from three shortlisted companies and will

BAHRAIN – Government to Upgrade Environmental Protection Regulations: The Public Commission for the Protection of Marine Resources, Environment and Wildlife in Bahrain will submit an urgent report calling for stricter environmental regulations. A variety of environmental issues were raised during Bahrain's National Dialogue, and a panel of experts, led by commission director-general Dr. Al Zayani, will compile the report and refer recommendations to the government for implementation. New environmental regulatory reforms will include stricter licensing to control industrial pollution levels.
