### **FACTS ABOUT DEPLOYMENT**

- During recent disasters VA and VHA were called upon to provide assistance in meeting local and state emergency medical needs.
- Emergency response and support are dynamic; no two deployments are the same.
- The magnitude of devastation and many variables directly affect the conditions one may face when deployed.
- Adequate accommodations may be available in some areas, others may be more primitive and challenging.
- Flexibility and personal preparedness are key elements for success as a VA DEMPS volunteer.
- You will continue to receive VA pay.
- Deployments are generally fourteen days, including two travel days.

- **Complete the "DEMPS Volunteer Data Sheet"** providing general demographic and background information which is maintained in a database for national and local responses.
- Secure approval from both your Supervisor and Facility Director.
- **Commit to prepare, practice and stay** ready by participating in initial and ongoing emergency management training, preparedness, and readiness activities.
