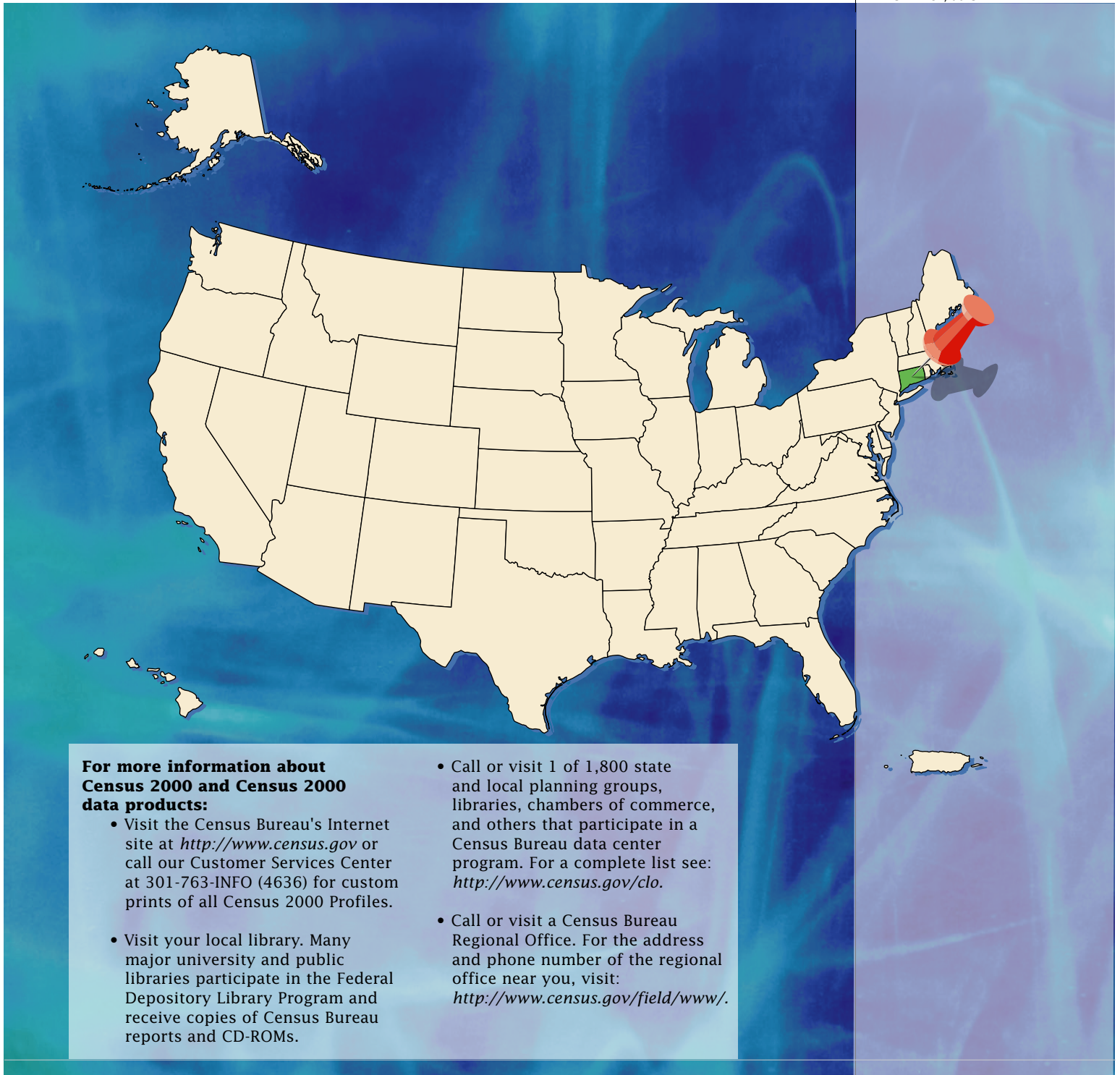

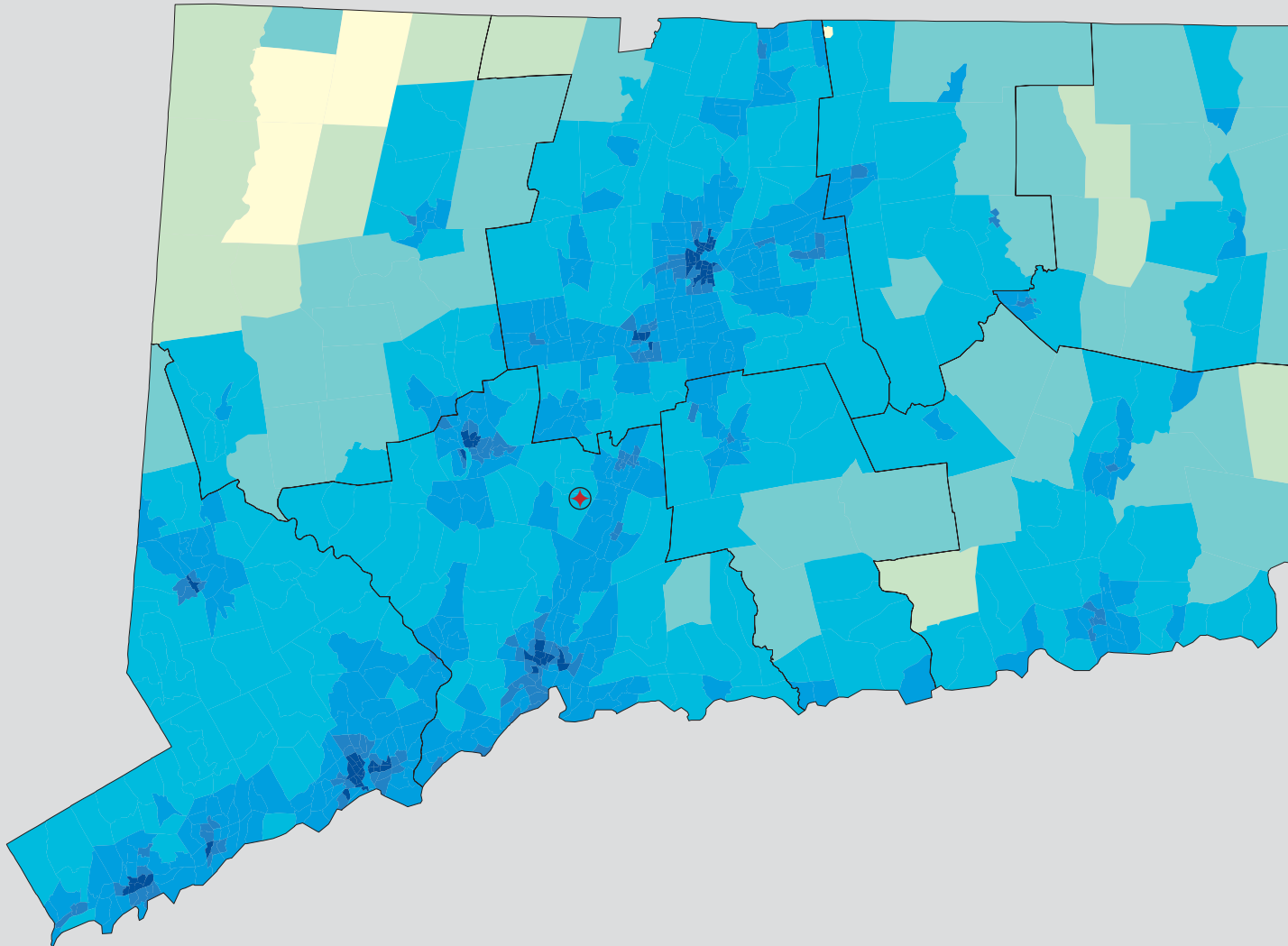

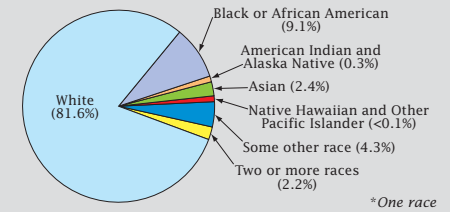

Population Density by Census Tract

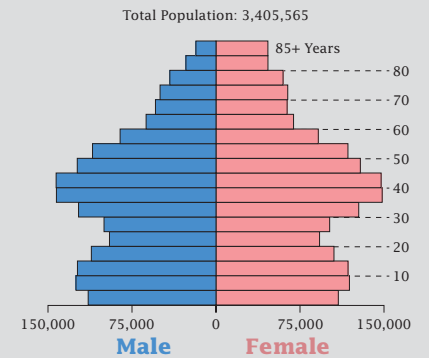


State Race* Breakdown

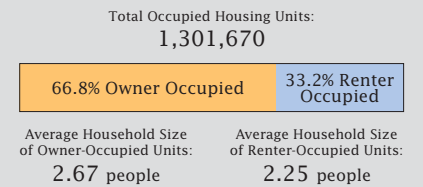


Hispanic or Latino (of any race) makes up **9.4%** of the state population.

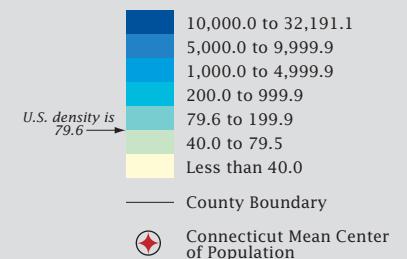
Population by Sex and Age
