Security Asset Protection Professional Certification Now Available!

CDSE is pleased to announce that the Security Asset Protection Professional Certification (SAPPC) assessment was launched February 27 and is now being administered. The SAPPC is the second of four professional certifications. Please note that the SFPC is a prerequisite for the SAPPC. Both the SFPC and the SAPPC assessments are offered at Linthicum, MD, on Mondays and Wednesdays.



SPeD assessments are offered after instructor-led courses.

STEPP Up for Certification!

To register for an assessment or update your account:

1. Go to <https://stepp.dss.mil> to update/complete your STEPP account. Please note that you should enter your name as you want it to appear on your certificate. If your account is current, proceed to Step 2.
2. Select a date and location from the SPeD Test Sites and Schedule. If registering for a remote test site, email the appropriate assessment center contact with your preferred date, time, and location. Please select a date at least 10 days from the date of your email.
3. If registering for an assessment following an instructor-led course, register for the Certification Assessment through STEPP at <https://stepp.dss.mil/selfregistration>. At the catalog under "Certification Programs," click on "Security Professional Education Development." Click on "Security Fundamentals Professional Certification Assessment Placeholder (SPED030.SP)" and click on the date, time, and location you wish to register for.

Reminder: If you are a DoD contractor, please indicate "industry" as your organization in STEPP. For example, Jane.Doe.ctr@any.af.mil would select "industry" rather than "Air Force."

All SPeD certification results will be available 15 days after the event via your STEPP account. You can access your results by logging into your STEPP account. On the STEPP home page, select "Learn," select "Training Schedule," and select "View Completed Registrations." The last column to the right of your Certification assessment, "Status," will indicate the results of your assessment. Candidate questions can be directed to the DSS SPeD Program Management Office at SPeD@dss.mil.

Show Off Your Status!

Have you been conferred the SFPC or SAPPC? Use your SFPC or SAPPC designation on business cards, resumes, and signature lines for as long as you maintain active status. The designation "SFPC" or "SAPPC" should appear in all capital letters after a comma following your name. For example, John Dough, SFPC or John Dough, SAPPC. If you have also been conferred the SAPPC, using both designations is optional. For example, John Dough, SFPC, SAPPC.

- Look for the SAPPC Candidate Handbook coming soon to the website!
- DSS has submitted a letter of intent to National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA) to seek accreditation for the SFPC examination. Created in 1987, the NCCA awards accreditation to professionally competent organizations. Accreditation is awarded based on the certification's processes and products rather than subject matter, and thus NCCA certification is applicable to a variety of professions. The NCCA has accredited over 200 programs for more than 100 organizations.
