# Subcontracting Plans

### **Small Business Subcontracting Plans**

Federal contractors are required to maintain an acceptable subcontracting plan if they are a **large business** (including *all* affiliates) <u>and</u> the **estimated dollar value** of the base contract exceeds, or is expected to exceed **\$650,000**.

Contractors that meet the above criteria must establish a subcontracting plan with specific dollar and percentage goals for subcontracting to small, HUBZone small, small disadvantaged, small woman-owned, veteran-owned small, and service –disabled veteran-owned small business firms. *This plan must be in place prior to contract award.* 

#### What You Need to Know...

#### **Plan Types**

There are two types of subcontracting plans: Commercial and Individual; deciding upon a plan type is left to the discretion of the VA FSS contractor.

#### **Commercial Plans**

A subcontracting plan that covers the company's fiscal year and that applies to the entire production of commercial items/services sold by either the entire company or a portion thereof. Commercial plans must be updated *annually* require *annual* reporting to eSRS.

#### **Individual Plans**

A subcontracting plan that is approved for the performance period of the contract, applies to a specific contract, and has goals that are based on the company's planned purchase of products and services needed to maintain a specific Federal contract. Individual plans require *semi-annual* reporting to eSRS.

#### **eSRS**

All VA FSS contractors with either a Commercial Small Business Subcontracting Plan or an Individual plan are required to file an annual Summary Subcontracting Report (SSR) and a Year-End Small Disadvantaged Business (SDB) Report through the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS). Individual plan holders are also required to file an Individual Subcontracting Report (ISR) biannually. All reports are due by October 30<sup>th</sup> of each year.



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
