NATO names Norwegian diplomat as Special Representative for Women, Peace and Security

NATO Secretary General Anders Fogh Rasmussen has appointed Norwegian diplomat Mari Skåre as his Special Representative for Women, Peace and Security.

"The appointment of the Special Representative demonstrates how much NATO values the unique contribution of women to our armed forces and operations and their important role in conflict prevention and resolution," he said. "That is why NATO has gender advisors at our top political and military headquarters and at our operational headquarters in Afghanistan and Kosovo. The appointment of a Special Representative means that these issues will be better taken into account at the highest political level."

New NATO's Bi-Strategic Command Directive 40-1

Last 8 August, the new NATO Bi-SC 40-1 on "Integrating UNSCR 1325 and Gender Perspective into the NATO Command Structure" was issued superseding that of 2009. It has been adapted to the additional UNSCRs and policies in combination with Lessons Identified. The Directive is a core document and aims to ensure the integration of Gender Perspectives in military organizations and forces in the NATO Command Struture and NATO Force Structure of the Alliance and within NATO-led operations.

NATO's "Female Leadership in Defence and Security" Project International Conference held on July 10 and 11 2012 in Sofia was devoted to "The Role of Female Leaders in Security and Defence: a Roadmap to Turn Potential into Capabilities". During the two-day Conference over 90 representatives from 21 NATO member states and Partnership for Peace Partners discussed issues related to the role of the strategic leadership in the capabilities building process, the diversity of human resources in the area of security and defence and the prospect for improvement of operational effectiveness.

For September, in which Germany has the Security Council presidency, the MAP provides recommendations on the situations in Afghanistan, Libya, Mali, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan / South Sudan, Syria and Yemen. The MAP also provides recommendations for the Security Council's ongoing implementation of its Women, Peace and Security obligations.

Teaching Gender to the Military

DCAF co-organised a joint workshop entitled "Teaching Gender to the Military - in the classroom and through Advanced Distributed Learning" on behalf of the PfPC Working Group on SSR in collaboration with the Education Development Working Group and in partnership with the NATO School in Oberammergau in July 2012. Educating the military on gender issues has, over the last five years, emerged as a new and important priority for NATO States and Partners. The workshop brought together twenty-seven experts on military education, gender training for the military and integrating gender in military operations, consolidating DCAF's ongoing engagement in capacity building with NATO staff on gender and SSR.
