Centers of Excellence Primary Care Education All Site Call Summary Coepce Publishing Guidelines

- Any site is at liberty to engage in scholarship activity for something that involves only the local site. However, if the activity involves more than one site, then the request needs to be routed through the Coordinating Center and have mechanism for appropriate inclusion of collaborators from other sites and the Coordinating Center.
- Please copy the Coordinating Center (Laural Traylor and Stuart Gilman) in local prepublication approval processes to dually achieve Office of Academic Affiliations technical requirements and need for knowledge about CoEPCE related and scholarly activity.
- Until another mechanism is identified, the person who generates the idea and follows-through should have opportunity for first authorship. First authorship is earned, meaning the person who does the majority of the work on the effort, should have first author rights.
- Whether the product is for enterprise or local purposes, interprofessional authorship is expected.
- In regards to manuscripts we are aware of currently in process (one with physician education focus, another with nurse education focus) there needs to be authorship cross linkage. For example, the first author on one paper should be a co-author on the other paper. Other authors should participate separately or jointly as appropriate for the paper.
- Copies of final products with appropriate references should be sent to the Coordinating Center. Coordinating Center staff are tracking all publications as one outcome of the program. In addition, the Coordinating Center is developing a library of Primary Care Education publications, presentations and other resources. Each site will have access to this product. * Though the CoEPCE portal is open for regular updates site program managers will be asked twice annually to ensure that all site level publications and presentations have been added with formal reference to the CoEPCE Publications and Presentations Portal (open for updates). This portal and the library will be the mechanism for sharing your hard work!

The Coordinating Center principals believe that currently organized writing groups are comfortable with the first author determinations for the manuscripts in development. If any of the current writing groups do not feel comfortable with authorship plans, they should alert the Center staff.

A word about priorities for this project. The goal for this overall effort is to advance and transform primary care education. This advancement is measured in many ways. Scholarly publication is significant, but it is not the most important issue for us to tackle.

Site Highlight: San Francisco EdPACT

The CoEPCE All Site Call continued this month presenting program progress and insights and vision for changes for the upcoming year. San Francisco (Rebecca Shunk and Susan Janson) reflected on their staff retreat and felt that they gained significant insight from the TDM Tool and the Scavenger Hunt Tool (Sharepoint). San Francisco did not feel that dramatic changes would be necessary for the new academic year, but instead are focusing on timing of performance improvement and other curriculum. In San Francisco, the NP Fellow program is new. The NP fellows will have a teaching role with their third year residents serving as mentors. On reflection, San Francisco is adding a Huddle EPA via Email (Ref: Sharepoint). Of interest, San Francisco trainees video tape their huddle to eliminate the need for supervision of that huddle. They continue to encourage collaborative visits between residents and trainees, which supports the collaborative learning process. San Francisco is working to flatten the hierarchal relationships. As such, the location of the San Francisco huddle often occurs in the NP room to have the residents meet the NPs in the NP space. San Francisco also held a "how to huddle session" and trainees use a huddle 'checklist.' Sharepoint. Cleveland, (Mimi Singh) served as discussant for this call and questioned the intensity of the huddle over time. It was reported that the enthusiasm of the huddle grows over time among participants, but it was emphasized that even a 10 minute period was helpful. In San Francisco, it was reported that huddles area standard practice for primary care, though the CoE EdPACT huddle are different in that there is more shared leadership. Pharmacy and Mental Health are typically active participants.

Seattle and West Haven will present CoEPCE insight at a future meeting.
