Combat Related Special Compensation Application Assistance

Assistance in completing CRSC applications will be available at the Copeland Soldier Service Center, 26 October 2012, 0900 - 1500 hours and Saturday, 27 October, 0900 -1600 hours. Eligible applicants include Retirees who served 20 years or more on Active Duty, or Reservists who are at least age 60 (in receipt of retired pay) and are entitled to retired pay that is offset by VA payments; and have at least 10% VA disability rating that is combat-related. Due to a recent law change, Medical Retirees who have less than 20 years but meet the other previous criteria are also eligible to apply.

ID Cards / DEERS Information

APPOINTMENTS ARE REQUIRED. EMERGENCY WALK-IN SERVICE AVERAGES A 1-2 HOUR WAIT TIME.

REQUIRED: Due to Homeland Security Presidential Directive, two (2) forms of valid identification are required to process ID Cards for all adults; one must be a photo ID each time a care is issued. Sponsor must be present for all transactions or Family Members must have current verified DD Form 1172 (Application for ID Cards/DEERS Enrollment) or valid General or Special Power of Attorney (Special Power of Attorney must state ID Cards/DEERS enrollments). **All documents must be original or certified.**

All Retirees and Family members who are in need of a new ID Card because of mutilation, expiration, or loss need to bring the following documents. These documents allow us to verify status in case the ID Cards computer system shuts down:

- Retirees: Retirement orders or DD Form
 214 for first time retirees.
- Family members must be accompanied by their Sponsor or have a valid Power of Attorney (POA); additionally, the following documents are required to obtain an ID Card:
 - (1) Retirement orders or DD Form 214
 - (2) Birth certificate (containing at least one of the parent's names). If parents are NOT married, then you must present court documentation signed by a judge determining sponsor is parent.
 - (3) Marriage certificate or certified copy (with seal).

- (4) Letter from college registrar's office stating that the dependent is a fulltime student and the expected date of graduation (for dependents age 21 to 23).
- (5) Divorce decree (original or certified)
- (6) Adoption papers (original or certified)
- (7) Unmarried surviving spouse must present 2 forms of valid ID's (State of Federal issued). First time surviving spouse: marriage certificate, death certificate, and birth certificate for surviving children's ID Card.

ID Card Online Appointments

To make online appointments, <u>Log on to https://rapids-appointments.dmdc.osd.mil/ and click "Make an Appointment."</u> ID Card appointments must be made for each individual receiving an ID Card or obtaining a DEERS transaction/update. Appointments/cancellations <u>must</u> be made 24 hours in advance to be processed.

Friendly ID Card Reminder for Military Retirees

Please note that when a military retiree reaches age 65 the medical portion of their ID Card (located on the back) expires. Please see directly below for information on TRICARE For Life (for all beneficiaries 65 and older) so that medical coverage will continue.

General Information



TRICARE For Life (TFL) is TRICARE's Medicare-wraparound coverage available to *all* Medicare-eligible TRICARE beneficiaries, regardless of age, provided they are eligible for Medicare Part A and enrolled in Medicare Part B.

While Medicare is your primary insurance, TRICARE acts as your secondary payer minimizing your out-of-pocket expenses. TRICARE benefits include covering Medicare's coinsurance and deductible.

Once a beneficiary and/or spouse reach age 65, DEERS should be updated to reflect Medicare eligibility with Part A/B on Medicare Card. For issuance of ID Card, Medicare Card must be presented on or after the effective date of Medicare eligibility.

To ensure eligibility for TRICARE benefits, beneficiaries 65 and older must have their current address on file with the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). Update change of addresses on the TRICARE Web site: www.tricare.mil/deers or by:

- Visiting the nearest military personnel office that has an ID Card facility.
- Calling Defense Manpower Data Center Support Office (DSO) phone center at 1-800-538-9552.
- Mailing the address change to DMDC Support Office, ATTN: Address Updates, 400 Giggling Road, Seaside, CA 93955-6771 (Please include the Sponsor's SSN in your correspondence.)
- Faxing your change of address to DSO, Attn: COA at (831) 655-8317.
- Sending an e-mail message to addrinfo@osd.pentagon.mil. Messages sent should be lower case only and include: the sponsor's name, social security number and telephone number, name(s) of Family Members affected by the address change, and the start date for the change.

MyPay Information On-line

A convenient way to check on your retired military pay status is to log on to the Web site: https://mypay/dfas.mil/mypay.aspx. MyPay makes it easy for you to view and make changes to your pay without having to wait on hold or mail in your changes. Try it today!

Retiree changes in address or status: Retirees are responsible for updating their pay file at DFAS-CL within one year of the event if they marry, remarry, are widowed or divorced and need to make or update an SBP election or beneficiary information (for unpaid allowances). If communicating by fax, include your SSN on all pages and sign your request.

Retiree requests for pay changes: You may also start, stop, or change allotments and change direct deposit information by calling the toll free number below.

Casualty Information Report Deaths Promptly

The death of retired Army members should be reported to the nearest Army post as soon as possible. This includes Army Reservist and Army National Guard members who are in a pay status.
