Now after six years of starving and little-by little going in debt, I finally, for the first time, make a meager amount of money this year. Please don't let someone steal my royalties. As you are aware, illegal downloading and piracy erode art and creators of that art in our country and all over the world everyday. Please make laws to make this a highly visible crime. Educate the uneducated, strictly enforce Copyright Law, and severely PUNISH the people scheming to make money off the backs of copyrighted materials.

It is an extremely hard road being self-employed and enduring the political landscape of the music business. To have my money stolen, once I have a little success, is criminal and a financial devastation my family.
