Write to me just as soon as you git this letter tell me if you are still living in the cabin where you used to live. tell eliza i send her my best respect and love ike and sully likelwise i would send you some money but i now it is impossible for you to git it i would like to see little jenkins now but i no it is impossible at present so no more but remain your own afectionate husband until death
