NAAG and NASCO invite you to attend the annual conference of state and federal regulators, nonprofit leaders, professional advisors and academics on Monday, October 1, 2012 at the Sheraton Silver Spring Hotel (formerly the Crowne Plaza Hotel) in Silver Spring, Maryland, a short ride on the Metro's Red Line from downtown Washington, D. C.

This conference is ideal for those involved in the nonprofit field as staff, leaders, advisors, and academics; the conference will spotlight areas of concern to federal and state regulators regarding the regulation of fiduciary duties, restricted funds, charitable trusts, charitable solicitation, and registration for charities and professional fundraisers.

Our keynote speaker will be Art Taylor, President and CEO of the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance.

The agenda offers a mix of presentations by highly qualified, thought-provoking speakers who will address topics keyed to this year's theme: The Evolution of the Nonprofit Sector. Michael Peregrine, a partner at McDermott, Will & Emery, LLP will discuss the latest corporate governance developments affecting nonprofits. Practitioners Victoria Bjorkland, a partner at Simpson, Thacher & Bartlett LLP and Bob Keatinge, of counsel at Holland & Hart LLP, will provide their perspectives on the growth in hybrid corporate structures. Pat Read, of Pat Read Consulting, and Peter Panepento, with the Chronicle of Philanthropy, will share their thoughts on the concerns facing the Sector. Ken Berger, with Charity Navigator, and Bennett Weiner, with

the Better Business Bureau Wise Giving Alliance, will address developing charity impact information. Jason Lilien, with the New York Attorney General's Office, will discuss that office's Leadership Committee Report and Initiative on Nonprofit Revitalization. We will also have an opportunity for regulators and public attendees to have some small group discussions about developments in the Sector. Ed Chansky, with Greenberg Traurig, will enlighten us with a presentation on "Perpetual Promotion Machines," which will explore the regulatory implications of permanent cause marketing programs. Tim Delaney, with the National Council on Nonprofits, will describe the top policy issues facing the Sector. Celia Roady, a partner with Morgan Lewis, and Alissa Gardenswartz, with the Colorado Attorney General' Office will exchange views on this year's "hot topics" for regulators and charities.

Plan on networking with expert faculty and regulators and connect with others who are passionate about protecting the important role that nonprofits play in our society by registering to attend.
