Senators Reid and McConnell:

We write to urge immediate Senate consideration of H.R. 5652- Sequester Replacement Reconciliation Act. If signed into law, this legislation would give Illinois the ability to make desperately needed changes to its Medicaid program by repealing the Medicaid Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement that was included in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

Repealing the Medicaid MOE would give Illinois the flexibility it needs to move forward with the implementation of income verification requirements that are allowed under state law, but are currently impossible under federal law. The state legislature adopted income verification requirements, on a bipartisan basis, as a way to reduce fraud in an overburdened system. Repealing the Medicaid MOE allows the State of Illinois to proceed with this important program integrity measure.

Without immediate changes to the Medicaid program, Illinois's state budget will continue to face ever-growing budget deficits. In January, the Civic Federation released *State of Illinois FY2013 Budget Roadmap: State of Illinois Budget Overview, Projections and Recommendations for the Governor and Illinois General Assembly*, an eye-opening report illustrating the dire fiscal situation Illinois will find itself in should it not take the necessary steps to reform Medicaid. Among the report's findings were that Medicaid is projected to increase by more than 40% over the next five years- costing our state \$12.1 billion in 2017. The report also projected Medicaid's costs will increase Illinois' total unpaid bills total to \$34.8 billion. Unless Illinois is given the flexibility to make changes, this program will continue to wreck havoc on an already troubled budget.

In addition to the Medicaid MOE requirement, the health law also expanded Medicaid eligibility to 133% of the federal poverty level. While the federal government will pay 100% of the costs for "newly eligible" beneficiaries, it will only do so for the first years of the expansion. Starting in 2017, Illinois will be required to provide a 5% match which grows to 10% in 2020 and beyond. Furthermore, Illinois is required to pay the costs of "previously eligible" beneficiaries- individuals who were formerly eligible for Medicaid but did not enroll. The Civic Foundation estimates this population will add an additional \$136-224 million in Medicaid costs.

A repeal of the Medicaid MOE will give Illinois' governor and state legislature added flexibility as they consider ways to close the \$2.7 billion hole in the state's Medicaid system.

We urge you to bring this vital legislation before the full Senate. Thank you for your attention to this important manner.
