BULLYING PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION PRO-8 **GRAMS; REAUTHORIZATION OF JUVENILE AC-**9 COUNTABILITY BLOCK GRANTS. 10 (a) BULLYING PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION. 11 (1) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (13) of section 12 1801(b) of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe 13 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796ee(b)) is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 "(13) establishing and maintaining account-16 ability-based programs that are designed to enhance 17 school safety, which programs may include research 18 to prevent bullying, the prevention of cyberbullying, 19 and gang prevention programs, as well as interven-20 tion programs regarding bullying;". 21 (2) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of 22 the Congress that the use of best practices in the ef-23 fort to combat bullying should be encouraged. 24 (b) REAUTHORIZATION OF JUVENILE ACCOUNT-ABILITY BLOCK GRANTS.—Section 1810(a) of such Act 25

11 (a) BULLYING PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (13) of section
13 1801(b) of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe
14 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796ee(b)) is amended
15 to read as follows:

"(13) establishing and maintaining accountability-based programs that are designed to enhance
school safety, which programs may include researchbased bullying prevention, cyberbullying prevention,
and gang prevention programs, as well as intervention programs regarding bullying;".

(2) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of the
Congress that the use of best practices is encouraged
for all activities for which grants under part R of
