Dear Mr. President:

Congress must pass end-of-year spending legislation for Fiscal Year 2011 before the end of the 111th Congress. We write to urge you to veto any end-of-year funding legislation that includes earmarks.

On November 2nd, American taxpayers sent a clear message to Washington that business as usual when it comes to federal spending has to end. In response to this decisive referendum, House and Senate Republicans have agreed to an earmark moratorium for the coming Congress. Last month you indicated that, "I agree with those Republican and Democratic members of Congress who've recently said that in these challenging days, we can't afford what are called earmarks."

Signing a year-end funding bill chocked full of unvetted Members' pet projects likely worth millions if not billions of dollars will only undermine the trust and confidence of the taxpayers. We urge you to send a clear message back to taxpayers by vetoing any Fiscal Year 2011 spending legislation that contains earmarks.


