- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Public Transit Security
- 5 and Local Law Enforcement Support Act".

1	SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION REGARDING USE OF GRANT FUNDS
2	RELATING TO OPERATIONAL COSTS OF PUB-
3	LIC TRANSIT SECURITY.
4	(a) In General.—Section 1406(b)(2) of the Imple-
5	menting Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of
6	2007 (6 U.S.C. 1135(b)(2)) is amended—
7	(1) by redesignating subparagraphs (E)
8	through (H) as subparagraphs (F) through (I), re-
9	spectively; and
10	(2) by inserting after subparagraph (D) the fol-
11	lowing new subparagraph (E):
12	"(E) specialized patrol teams, as defined
13	by the Secretary in coordination with the recipi-
14	ents of grants under this section, including the
15	sustainment of such teams without fiscal year
16	or other limitation;".
17	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
18	subsection (a) shall take effect on the date of enactment
19	of this Act and shall apply to grants made under section
20	1406 of the Implementing Recommendations of the $9/11$
21	Commission Act of 2007 (6 U.S.C. 1135) on or after such
22	date.
