When Mr. WALKER, Chairman, pursuant to House Resolution 44, reported the joint resolution back to the House with an amendment adopted by the Committee.

The previous question having been ordered by said resolution.

The following amendment, reported from the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union, was agreed to:

Strike out all after the resolving clause and insert:

"ARTICLE —

"Section 1. Total outlays for any fiscal year shall not exceed total receipts for that fiscal year, unless three-fifths of the whole number of each House of Congress shall provide by law for a specific excess of outlays over receipts by a rollcall vote.

"SECTION 2. The limit on the debt of the United States held by the public shall not be increased, unless three-fifths of the whole number of each House shall provide by law for such an increase by a rollcall vote.

"SECTION 3. Prior to each fiscal year, the President shall transmit to the Congress a proposed budget for the United States Government for that fiscal year in which total outlays do not exceed total receipts.

"Section 4. No bill to increase revenue shall become law unless approved by a majority of the whole number of each House by a rollcall vote.

"SECTION 5. The Congress may waive the provisions of this article for any fiscal year in which a declaration of war is in effect. The provisions of this article may be waived for any fiscal year in which the United States is engaged in military conflict which causes an imminent and serious military threat to national security and is so declared by a joint resolution, adopted by a majority of the whole number of each House, which becomes law.

"SECTION 6. The Congress shall enforce and implement this article by appropriate legislation, which may rely on estimates of outlays and receipts.

"SECTION 7. Total receipts shall include all receipts of the United States Government except those derived from borrowing. Total outlays shall include all outlays of the United States Government except for those for repayment of debt principal.

"SECTION 8. This article shall take effect beginning with fiscal year 2002 or with the second fiscal year beginning after its ratification, whichever is later.".

Passed the House of Representatives January 26, 1995.

The joint resolution, as amended, was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read a third time by title.

Mr. CONYERS moved to recommit the joint resolution to the Committee on the Judiciary with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with the following amendment:

At the end of the matter proposed to be added as an article of amendment to the Constitution, strike the period and closing quotation marks and add the following new section:

"SECTION .-Total receipts shall not include receipts (including attributable interest) for the financing of benefits and administrative expenses of the Federal Old-Age and Survivors Insurance Trust Fund and the Federal Disability Insurance Trust Fund, or any successor funds, and total outlays shall not include outlays for disbursements of the Federal Old-Age and Survivors Insurance Trust Fund for benefits and administrative expenses and the Federal Disability Insurance Trust Fund for benefits and administrative expenses, or any successor funds. The receipts and outlays referred to in the pre-ceding sentence shall be limited to receipts and outlays that provide old-age and survivor cash benefits for individuals based upon their earnings and dependents of such earners or provide disability cash benefits for disabled individuals based upon their earnings and dependents of such earners.
