

for reducing the burden of Federal paper-work on the public, and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight. After general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill and the amendments recommended by the Committee on Government Reform and Oversight now printed in the bill shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such amendments as may have been adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without intervening motion except one motion to recommit.

When said resolution was considered.

After debate,

On motion of Mr. LINDER, the previous question was ordered on the resolution to its adoption or rejection and under the operation thereof, the resolution was agreed to.

A motion to reconsider the vote whereby said resolution was agreed to was, by unanimous consent, laid on the table.

30.13 PAPERWORK REDUCTION

The SPEAKER pro tempore, Mr. LAZIO, pursuant to House Resolution 91 and rule XXIII, declared the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 830) to amend chapter 35 of title 44, United States Code, to further the goals of the Paperwork Reduction Act to have Federal agencies become more responsible and publicly accountable for reducing the burden of Federal paperwork on the public, and for other purposes.

SEC. . SUNSET.

(a) REPEAL OF CHAPTER.—Chapter 35 of title 44, United States Code, is repealed.

(b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—The table of chapters at the beginning of title 44, United States Code, is amended by striking the item relating to chapter 35.

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect 5 years after the date of the enactment of this Act.
