

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree awarded
- First pharmacy school based in the Fort Worth-Dallas Metroplex
- Opening class size – 80 students; 100 students thereafter
- Three years of didactic courses and introductory pharmacy practice experiences
- One year of advanced pharmacy practice experience

## ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS – ALL APPLICANTS MUST:

- Be a U.S. citizen or U.S. permanent resident
- Have completed the pre-pharmacy prerequisites (70 credit hours) prior to matriculation. Students may take prerequisites at UNT, UNT Dallas or other universities and two/four year colleges.
- Achieve a minimum 2.50 grade point average on all completed coursework
- Obtain three (3) letters of recommendation
- Complete the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT)

## TIMELINES

- Accreditation process ongoing\*
- October 2012 through March 1, 2013 – Apply for Admission
- November 2012 through April 2013 – Applicant Interviews
- August 12-16, 2013 - Orientation Week
- August 19, 2013 – Classes begin

## ADMISSIONS PROCESS

### APPLY

Submit an online application through the *UNT System College of Pharmacy Application Service* and a non-refundable application processing fee of \$50.00.

### INTERVIEW

Office of Admissions staff will review all applicant information and invite prospective applicants to interview for the PharmD program. Note that not all applicants will be invited to interview.

### DECISION

Admissions Committee will review the entire applicant file and make a decision on the applicant's entry into the PharmD program.
