Crop sales accounted for \$9,039,844 of the total value in 2002.

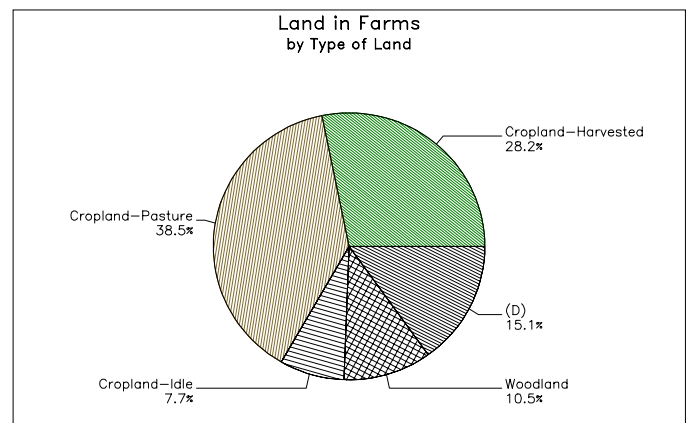
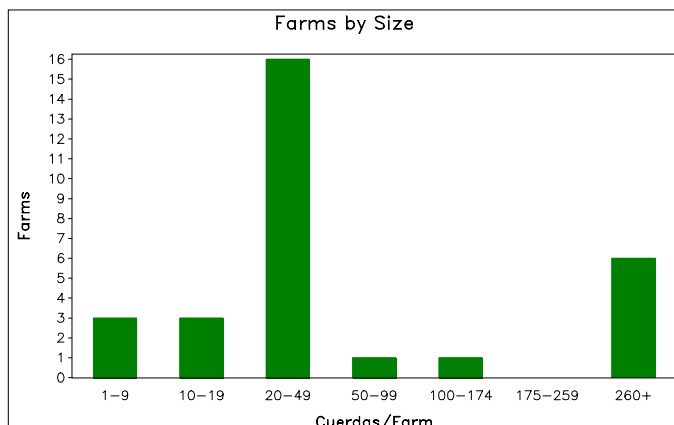
