Crop sales accounted for \$272,946 of the total value in 2002.

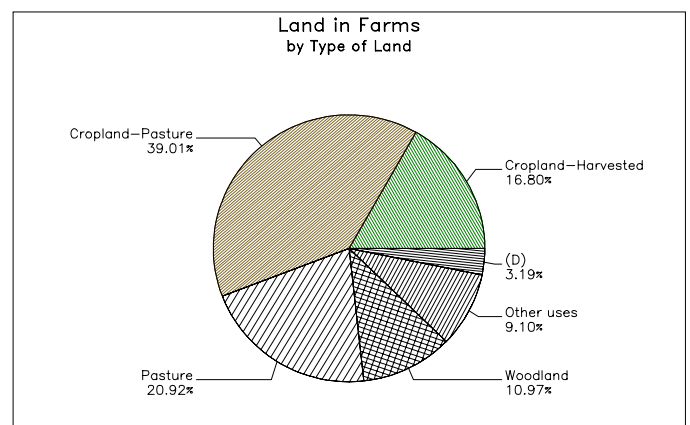
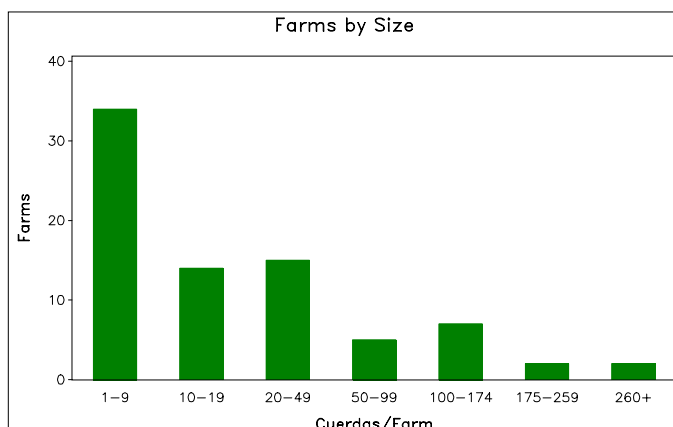
