




GOAL #1 Recover 100% of jobs lost due to the Great Recession by the End of FY2014



We've recovered 122,500 of the jobs lost during the recession. That's nearly 85% of all jobs lost - the 7th fastest recovery rate in the nation.


GOAL #2 Improve student achievement and school, college and career readiness by 25% by end 2015


GOAL #3 Increase the number of Marylanders who receive skills training by 20% by end 2012


GOAL #4 Reduce violent crime by 20% by end 2012


GOAL #5 Reduce violent crimes committed against women and children by 25% by end 2012


GOAL #6 Make Maryland the national leader in homeland security preparedness by end 2012

We have already met or are close to meeting the majority of our 2012/2013 Bay Restoration Goals.


GOAL #8 Double transit ridership in Maryland by end of 2020

In 2012, average weekday ridership on MTA was 377,877 riders per weekday, a 17.9 % increase compared to the 2006 baseline.


GOAL #9 Reduce per-capita peak demand and per capita electricity consumption in Maryland by 15% by 2015



As of 2011, Marylanders reduced peak electricity demand by over 9% and per capita electricity consumption by over 5% since 2007.

GOAL #10 Increase Maryland's in-state renewable generation to 20% by 2022


RENEWABLE ENERGY GENERATION AS A PERCENT OF MARYLAND'S TOTAL ENERGY GENERATION

GOAL #11 Reduce Maryland's greenhouse gas emissions by 25% by 2020


ACTUAL & ESTIMATED GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS



According to 2011 emissions estimates, greenhouse gasses have been reduced by 5% from the 2006 baseline


GOAL #12 End childhood hunger in Maryland by 2015

Compared to our first year in office, 56% more Maryland students are eating breakfast at school and 33% more are eating lunch.


GOAL #13 Reduce infant mortality in Maryland by 10% by 2012

AVERAGE DAILY ACTIVE PATIENTS IN STATE-FUNDED TREATMENT




There are approximately 34% more patients receiving treatment on a daily basis today than in FY2008.
