## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

*Ordered*, That no later than Wednesday, July 12, 2000, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of Madelyn R. Creedon, of Indiana, to be Deputy Administrator for Defense Programs, National Nuclear Security Administration. (Cal. No. 524).

*Ordered further*, That there be two hours for debate equally divided in the usual form, and that following the use or yielding back of the time the Senate then proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate then return to legislative session.
