ASSISTANT REGISTER OF COPYRIGHTS FOR REGISTRATION APPOINTED

Waldo H. Moore, Chief of the Copyright Office Reference Division, has been promoted to the position of Assistant Register of Copyrights for Registration.

A career staff member, Mr. Moore began work in the Copyright Office in 1951, and soon thereafter became Head of the Materials Control Section. This was followed by service in the Examining Division successively as an Examiner, a Reviser, the Head of the Book Section, and the Assistant Chief of that division. In 1963 he became Chief of the Reference Division.

Mr. Moore received a Bachelor of Laws degree from the George Washington University and a Master of Patent Laws degree from the National University (now a part of the George Washington University). He is a member of the District of Columbia Bar and the Virginia State Bar. Also, he is a member of the American Bar Association, the Federal Bar Association (of which he is a past president of the Capitol Hill Chapter), the Copyright Society of the U.S.A., and the Bibliographical Society of America.

In addition, he has served as Adjunct Professor of Copyright Law at the Washington College of Law of the American University and is at present Professorial Lecturer in Copyright Law at the National Law Center of the George Washington University.
