

## SUSAN B. ARAMAYO APPOINTED CHIEF,

## COPYRIGHT OFFICE LICENSING DIVISION

Susan B. Aramayo was appointed the first Chief of the new Licensing Division, Copyright Office, effective September 28, 1977. This new division is responsible for implementing the sections of Public Law 94-553 dealing with compulsory licenses for certain uses of some copyrighted works.

Ms. Aramayo received B.A. and M.L.S. degrees from the University of Pittsburgh. She joined the staff of the Library of Congress in 1965 and served in a variety of technical and administrative positions in the Descriptive Cataloging Division, Shared Cataloging Division, and the Cataloging Instruction Office. Before she joined the Copyright Office, she was Educational Liaison Officer, Office of the Assistant Librarian for Public Education. In that position she co-ordinated and administered the Library's visitor program, involving the planning and implementation of schedules for officials of other governments; foreign librarians, educators, and scholars; and U.S. professional individuals and groups.

Her positions as Vice-President and President of the Library of Congress Professional Association in 1974 and 1975 respectively are examples of her active participation in staff and professional activities of the Library. In addition, she served on the Library of Congress Intern Committee in 1977 as the representative of the Office of the Librarian.
