Rep. Marino is proud to be a co-sponsor of HR2, the House resolution that repealed the massive health-care overhaul

passed last year by the previous Congress in a partisan vote. He was even more proud that the House on Jan. 19 overwhelming passed the resolution, making way for a fresh start

Congressman Marino signed onto the historic bill for several reasons but cited the "damage the government takeover of the
