#### Variant Titles

A note may be essential to show a variation from the chief source title appearing elsewhere in the item. Although the source may contain more than one title, record in a note only the needed variant title, not titles already given in the description. (Always include in the note the source of the variant.)

#### Nonroman Records

For languages that have bibliographic cards that are not romanized, the Library of Congress observes the practices detailed below.

- 1) Entries filed, or subfiled, under publication title. On bibliographic cards for which no uniform title is appropriate, entries under a name heading show the romanized title proper printed within parentheses under the heading; the "Title romanized" note is omitted. For items entered under title proper, the romanized title proper is enclosed within parentheses and printed in boldface type as a hanging indention; the nonroman item title appears under this as another hanging indention beginning on a separate line. Exception for writing systems that read from right to left: For title entries the romanized title begins at the left margin, i.e., where each nonroman line in the body of the entry ends; the nonroman item title begins as a hanging indention beginning at the right margin.
- 2) Entries filed, or subfiled, under uniform title. For the benefit of other libraries, cards that have a uniform title also bear a romanization of the title proper within parentheses under the uniform title. The title is traced as "Title"-period if an added entry for it is being made (cf. 21.30J). (A romanization of the title proper is made even if it is identical to the uniform title.)

Note: If the title being romanized begins with an article, omit it from the romanized title.

#### Length of title romanized

When romanizing a title proper, generally romanize the whole title proper (including an alternative title). However, 1.184 does not provide for a shortening technique, necessary in cases of "long" titles. A "long" title should be understood as a title that is "too long," with a more precise understanding of this extreme length left to the judgment of the cataloger. Keep in mind that a general shortening is not what the rule suggests. Normally, as already stated, romanize the entire title proper. The rule provides a technique for use after the cataloger has felt a need for it. Note that in applying the technique, words omitted must always be at the end, never before the sixth word nor somewhere in the middle, and the part preceding the omission must be a phrase that will stand alone. Abridge the title romanization and the transcription of the nonroman title proper to the same extent. Indicate the omission by the mark of omission in the title and statement of responsibility area but not in the title |

## 4) Items without a collective title

If the item lacks a collective title, romanize all the titles up to the first recorded parallel title, other title information, or statement of responsibility, whichever occurs first (cf. LCRI 21.30J). (These provisions are applicable even if no added entry is being made for the title of the item and without regard to the uniform title that may be assigned to the record.)

## 5) Corrected titles (cf. 1.0F)

- a) Titles corrected by "[i.e. ...]" or "[sic]." If the nonroman title being romanized has been corrected in the nonroman transcription by the "[i.e. ...]" or "[sic]" technique, romanize the title in this form. i.e., romanize the title that appears on the item and include "[i.e. ...]" or "[sic]." (If an added entry is needed, make one added entry for the romanized form of the title with the "[i.e. ...]" or "[sic]" and another added entry for the romanized form of the title as if it had appeared correctly. Trace the titles explicitly except trace as "Title"—period the title containing "[i.e. ...]" or "[sic]" when it appears within parentheses according to 2) above.)
- b) Titles corrected by bracketing missing letters. If the nonroman title being romanized has been corrected in the nonroman transcription by supplying in brackets a missing letter or letters, romanize the title in this form, i.e., romanize the title with brackets and the supplied letter or letters. (If an added entry is needed, make one added entry for the title romanized with the brackets and the supplied letter or letters and another added entry for the romanized form of the title as it appears on the item. Trace the titles explicitly except trace as "Title"-period the title containing the brackets and the supplied letter or letters when it appears within parentheses according to 2) above.)

## 22.6. ENTRY UNDER TITLE OF NOBILITY. [Rev.]

Note that the application of the basic provisions of this rule often results in a form of name for a person of nobility that is not the form most commonly found in the chief sources of information of that person's works. The first and second sentences of the rule apply the basic provisions of 22.1A-B to nobility. Therefore, the Duke of Wellington whose personal name was Arthur Wellesley is entered under the proper name of the title, i.e., "Wellington." The third sentence gives instruction for formulating the name: follow the proper name in the title by the person's personal name in direct order and follow the personal name by the term of rank. Application of this rule to the Duke of Wellington results in the heading "Wellington, Arthur Wellesley, Duke of" despite the fact that "Duke of Wellington" is the form of name by which he is commonly known under the provisions of 22.1A-B.

Apply 22.6 to persons of nobility who are known primarily as authors and who use on their works only a term of rank and their title without forenames.

Apply the directive "excluding unused forenames" as follows: If the person of nobility is known primarily as an author, use in the heading the forenames most commonly found in the chief sources of information of the person's works. If no forenames are found in the chief sources or if the person is not primarily known as an author, consult reference sources. If reference sources vary, use the least number of forenames commonly found.

If the person known primarily as an author is entered under his or her title of nobility and the statement of responsibility on the author's works consists of the person's term of rank and title without forenames, make a reference from the title and term. (Do not apply the technique specified in LCRI 22.16A of adding other names in parentheses after the title in the reference.)

Rule 22.15A, covering names consisting only of a surname plus an associated word or phrase, actually includes two quite distinct types of name:

- 1) Names established because of a regular practice of using only the surname with a term of address in statements of responsibility on the chief source. This was a normal practice in the 18th and early 19th centuries and is an infrequent, although not unusual, practice today in some languages (e.g., abbé Deidier).
- "Phrase" headings consisting of a surname and an associated word or phrase. Most such headings are pseudonyms or assumed names (e.g., Dr. Seuss, Miss Read, Grandma Moses).

Generally make a cross reference from the direct form only for names in the second category.

Serials/Including Series

1) General. Create a uniform title made up of the title proper plus a parenthetical qualifier for any serial entered under title if the title proper is identical to the title proper of another serial in the catalog. Also, create such a uniform title if the title proper is identical to the title proper of another serial found in a related work added entry or in a linking entry note (fields 760-787) on a bibliographic record in the catalog. (Disregard the choice of entry of the serial (under title or under name heading) when considering whether the titles are identical.) The "catalog" referred to here is the file against which the searching and cataloging is being done. Serial catalogers are permitted to take into account any serial of the same title of which they know, whether or not it is in the catalog (e.g., it might be found in a reference work being searched by a serial cataloger for some other reason). Take into account only the main title of another serial, not variants traced as cross references or as added entries. In general, apply the following:

- a) Do not predict a conflict.
- b) Resolve the conflict by adding a uniform title to the bibliographic record for the serial being cataloged; do not add one also to the record for the serial cataloged earlier.

The uniform title created is used not only as the main entry heading on the bibliographic record for the serial itself but also whenever the serial is referred to in other access points (added or subject entries) and in linking notes.

- 2) Choice of qualifying term. The terms most commonly used to qualify the title proper are the following:
  - a) Place of publication

b) Corporate body

c) Place and date or Corporate body and date

d) Date

e) Edition statement, other title information, etc.

Depending on the situation, use either one term or a combination of terms. The order of the terms listed above is not intended as prescriptive; identify the particular situation and use the appropriate term or terms. For example, different editions of the same work, which bear differentiating edition statements, will ordinarily be distinguished by the use of the last mentioned category of terms above, as the first choice from the point of view of appropriateness. There is a special problem with the choice place vs. body, however, and when one is facing this choice, follow the hierarchy indicated both by the order and the wording of the first two of the provisions below.

 Place of publication. Generally, use place of publication as the qualifying term.

If the work is published in more than one place or if the place of publication has changed, choose as the qualifying term the place that would be named first in the publication, distribution, etc., area for the first issue published or the earliest issue for which a place is known or the earliest issue in hand—in that order of preference. (Use caution when taking information from an existing bibliographic record for the serial needing a qualifier if the record was originally created before 1981; it may not necessarily show the earliest place since pre-AACR 2 cataloging codes specified giving the latest place.)

- 4) Corporate body. Exceptionally, in the following cases use as the qualifier the heading for the body with which the work originated or by which it was issued or published:
- a) The title proper consists solely of an indication of type of publication and/or periodicity (exclusive of articles, prepositions, and conjunctions).

If more than one corporate body is associated with the work, choose as the qualifying term the name of the body responsible for the serial, rather than the one only publishing it. If multiple bodies are performing the same function in relation to the work, choose the one named first.

b) The addition of place as a qualifying term is inadequate to resolve the conflict, because another work with the same title was published in the same place.

c) The title includes the initials or other abbreviation of the issuing body's name.

- 5) Other qualifiers. Make the choice from the following possibilities, according to what is most appropriate for the particular situation:
- a) Use a combination of either place and date or corporate body and date, whichever would be appropriate according to the preceding statements for place and body alone.

6) Form of qualifying term. The form of the qualifier is shown by the examples above. Note that normal practice for qualifiers added to corporate headings apply here also, with a single exception: When a body (as opposed to a geographic name) is used as a qualifier, copy its heading from the name authority record exactly, with no deletions, rearrangements, changes in punctuation, etc.

## 7) Special situations

- a) Unnumbered/numbered titles from the same body. If one body issues both an unnumbered series and a numbered series or serial with the same title, add the qualifier "(Unnumbered)" to the title for the unnumbered series in all cases of such a conflict. (For example, if the new title is numbered and the existing title is unnumbered, change the existing unnumbered series to add "(Unnumbered)" to the title.) Conversely, do not add a qualifier to the title of the numbered series or serial to resolve the conflict with the unnumbered series issued by the body.
- b) Common/section titles. If the title proper of a serial consists of a common title and the title of a section or part (see 12.1B3), create a uniform title to delete the initial article from the title of the section or part. Apply this even when the section title is preceded by a numeric or alphabetic designation.

Otherwise, create a uniform title for the work only if there is another serial with exactly the same common title and title of a section or part, i.e., do not create a uniform title when there is another serial with a title that is the same as the common title but with a different title of a section or part. (Disregard the fact that one or more of the section titles of a particular common title may bear a uniform title but other section titles of the same title do not or that a particular common title when appearing alone has a uniform title but the same common title appearing with its section titles does not.)

Generally, place the qualifier at the end, i.e., following the title of the section or part.

d) Reprints, microform copies, etc. When a serial reappears as a reprint, as a microform copy or reissue, as a braille edition, etc., do not use a uniform title to distinguish one of these secondary manifestations from the original. If the original itself has a uniform title, use the same uniform title for the other manifestation.

The preceding represents the Library of Congress policy. To others who wish to make the differentiation not provided here, LC recommends that they not use the technique of a uniform title including parenthetical qualifier. Instead, they should use for the secondary manifestation a special uniform title that consists of the title (or uniform title) of the original followed by a period and a subdivision designating the secondary manifestation appropriately.

e) Changes in uniform title headings. When the name of a corporate body is used as a qualifying term in the uniform title and the name of that body changes or the body's responsibilities for the publication are assumed by another body, create a new record (successive entry), using the new form of name (or the name of the body newly responsible) as the qualifying term in the uniform title. Relate the two records by means of a linking entry note, citing each in uniform title form. (Also, make connecting references between the two titles in the case of monographic series.)

If something other than a corporate body has been used as a qualifying term and there is a change in its form or in fact, do not create a new entry. (A note may be added to the record indicating that a change has occurred; if the work is a series, make a reference from the title followed by the changed qualifier.)

If a title established before September 1983 is qualified by body but under current policy would be qualified by a different qualifier, change the qualifier whenever the existing corporate body qualifier becomes inappropriate (as when the name of the body changes or when the body is no longer responsible for the publication). This means creating one record for the publication (and changing or deleting existing records as appropriate).

Do not otherwise change uniform title headings to bring them in line with these instructions.

If a monograph is entered under a title proper that is the same as the title proper main entry of another work, do not assign a uniform title to either work simply to distinguish them, even if there are multiple editions of either work.

However, if another manifestation of one of these works requires a uniform title (e.g., a translation, excerpts) or if one of these works is used in a subject or added entry, assign a uniform title to the particular work according to the provisions for adding a qualifier to a serial title. (If a multipart monograph has been issued in multiple editions and is analyzable, treat each edition as a different work for purposes of assigning a uniform title; generally, use the edition statement as the qualifying term.) This same uniform title must be used in all entries for the work. Existing records in which the work appears as a main or secondary entry must be changed. Note: Do not assign a uniform title if the conflicting work is being used only in an analytical added entry.

#### Radio and Television Programs

Add the qualifier "(Radio program)" or "(Television program)" to the title of a radio or television program whenever the program is needed in a secondary entry and the title is the same as a Library of Congress subject heading or the title has been used as the title of another work. (It does not matter if the other work is entered under title or under a name heading.) This same uniform title for the radio or television program must be used in all entries for the particular work. (Existing records in which the radio or television program has been used as a main or added entry must be adjusted.)

## U.S. Census Publications

For U.S. Bureau of the Census publications that contain the census or parts of it, use a uniform title consisting of the name of the census, qualified by the year of the census. Add to this basic uniform title parts of the census as subdivisions.

If a comic strip, single panel cartoon, etc., is entered under its title, establish a uniform title for the work that consists of its title, followed by an appropriate parenthetical qualifier (e.g., "Batman (Comic strip)").

## Motion Pictures

If a motion picture is entered under a title proper that is the same as the title proper of another motion picture (or other work), do not assign a uniform title to either to distinguish them, even if there are multiple editions of either work. However, if a motion picture is needed in a secondary entry and the title of the motion picture is the same as a Library of Congress subject heading or the title is the same as the title of another work, add the qualifier "(Motion picture)" to the title of the motion picture. This same uniform title must be used in all entries for the particular work. (Existing records in which the motion picture is used as a main or secondary entry must be adjusted.)

Computer Programs

If a computer program is entered under a title proper that is the same as the title proper of another computer program (or other work), do not assign a uniform title to either work simply to distinguish them, even if there are multiple editions of either work. However, if a computer program entered under title is needed in a secondary entry, add the qualifier "(Computer program)" to the title of the computer program. This same uniform title must be used in all entries for the particular work. (Existing records in which the computer program is used as a main entry must be adjusted.)

## UPGRADE OF LC MLC RECORDS TO FULL ONES

As a result of the planning done within the context of the National Coordinated Cataloging Program (NCCP), procedures have now been developed to enable NCCP participants to upgrade LC originated minimal level cataloging (MLC) records to full ones. The major characteristic noticeable about such records is that they will contain both a participant—assigned call number and a Library of Congress MLC shelf number. The following characteristics detail an upgraded MLC record:

- 001 field. The same conventions are applied as for any other change record, the most obvious being the presence of revision information.
- 2) 050 field. The participant-assigned call number appears as the first 050 field in the record; the indicator is set to "1" (not in LC), and the call number itself contains a lowercase "x" (to signal a participant-assigned call number). The previously existing LC MLC shelf number appears as the second 050; the indicator is set to "0" (in LC).

- 3) 039 field. In records upgraded prior to October 26, 1987, the values in this field were changed from 1 2 0 0 1 to 2 3 3 3 3; for records upgraded after that date the field does not appear in the ugpraded record.
- 4) 040 field. An 040 field is present and contains the upgrading library's NUC symbol in a #d subfield, usually the sole #d subfield unless the record has subsequently been updated by an agency different from the upgrading one.
- 008 field. All the fixed fields are reviewed and will have been set to the values appropriate to full cataloging.
- Encoding level (USMARC Leader/17). The encoding level 6) contains blank (full level).

Harvard University began upgrading LC MLC records in February 1987; other NCCP participants will begin in 1988.

### CATALOGING SOURCE FIXED FIELD

In October 1987 the Library of Congress made some changes in practice regarding the values used in the cataloging source fixed field (USMARC 008/39). The value "d" (non-LC cataloging) was used in the cataloging source fixed field from 1981-September 1987 for United States Government Printing Office/LC cataloging (040+a = DGPO/DLC) and from 1984-September 1987 for National Library of Medicine/LC CIP cataloging (040 = DNIM/DLC). Beginning October 1, 1987, the Library of Congress began to use value "c" (Library of Congress cooperative cataloging) in both types of records. This change in practice applies only to records input to the LC system and distributed through the Library's MARC distribution service. The change was made to standardize practice to facilitate identifying national level cataloging records.

There are approximately 20,000 records in the LC machine file that reflect the former practice of using value "d"; the feasibility of updating these records by program and redistributing them to subscribers to the MARC distribution service in being explored. In the meantime, records will be changed on an as-encountered basis, i.e., if the record is being changed for some other reason, the value "d" in 008/39 will be changed to value "c."

## TAGGING AND SUBFIELD CODING OF SUBJECT HEADINGS FOR GROUPS OF COUNTRIES AND REGIONS

Subject headings that designate groups of countries or regions of the world are tagged 151 (geographic) in subject authority records. Consequently, when these headings are used in "a" subfields in bibliographic records, the field is tagged 651. Any topical or form subdivision authorized for use under names of places (listed in H 1140 in the Subject Cataloging Manual: Subject Headings) may be used under headings of this type. These headings may also be used as geographic subdivisions under other headings that are authorized to be divided geographically. When used in this manner, the subfield is coded "z." This applies to headings that represent geographically contiguous groups of countries, such as Scandinavia, Benelux countries, Slavic countries, or groups of countries that share a common political, ethnic, or other trait, regardless of whether they are geographically contiguous, such as Developing countries, European Economic Community countries, Arab countries, Communist countries, or regions that are geographically contiguous or share a common trait, such as Alpine regions, Polar regions, Tropics.

## LC CLASSIFICATION SCHEDULES

The printed size of the LC classification schedules has neen  $T_{\rm W}"$  x 10%" for many years. Recently, a decision was made to change the size to 8%" x 11". This will allow for more blank space and/or information on each printed leaf. It will also allow more gutter space for those who wish to punch holes for insertion into a looseleaf binder.

This change will appear first with the publication of the third edition of schedules BR-BV, DJK-DK, and DS. *LC Classification-Additions and Changes* will continue to be printed in the smaller size in 1986. ## LC THESAURUS FOR GRAPHIC MATERIALS

LC Thesaurus for Graphic Materials: Topical Terms for Subject Access has recently been published. Prepared by the Prints and Photographs Division, this publication provides a list of more than 6,000 terms from which catalogers and researchers can choose indexing and retrieval vocabulary for graphic materials. It also includes provisions for applying the terms as access points. The terms complement and enhance Library of Congress Subject Headings.

The thesaurus provides a substantial body of terms for subject indexing of pictures, particularly large general collections of historical images that are found in many libraries, historical societies, archives, and museums. The terms are authorized for use in machine-readable records.

The thesaurus may be used for indexing graphic materials in a broad range of formats, including original prints, drawings, photographs, and pictorials ephemera. It offers catalogers a controlled vocabulary for describing a wide range of subjects, including activities, objects, types of people, events, and places depicted in still images. It includes only subject categories. It may also be used by the researcher, by offering terms and scope notes that will help in the selection of appropriate terms to retrieve images.

The thesaurus serves as a companion volume to Descriptive Terms for Graphic Materials: Genre and Physical Characteristics Headings (see Cataloging Service Bulletin, no. 35, p. 39) and Graphic Materials: Rules for Describing Original Items and Historical Collections (see Cataloging Service Bulletin, no. 35, p.39).
