SUBDIVISION SIMPLIFICATION PROGRESS

Since the Subject Subdivisions Conference took place at Airlie House, Virginia, in May 1991, progress continues to be made in simplifying subdivisions in the Library of Congress Subject Headings system. On Weekly Lists 95-16 to 95-28, changes were made in the following areas:

Recommendation #1. Toward achieving the recommended standard order of [topic]—[place]—[chronology]—[form] in LC subject heading strings, new topical subdivisions for which geographic orientation is logical are now established with the designation (*May Subd Geog*). On a case-by-case basis, subdivisions not previously divided by place are being authorized for geographic subdivision. Forty subdivisions not previously divided by place, including sixteen free-floating subdivisions listed below, were authorized for geographic subdivision during this period.

Recommendation #3. Four chronological subdivisions established under **Great Britain—History** that conflated the reigns of seven rulers were cancelled in favor of using existing headings for the separate reigns, e.g., **Great Britain—History—Edward I, II, 1272-1327** was cancelled in favor of **Great Britain—History—Edward I, 1272-1307** and **Great Britain—History—Edward II, 1307-1327**.

Recommendation #6. During the second quarter of 1995, progress in simplifying subdivisions was made in the following areas:

1) *Cancellation of subdivisions or headings that represent the same or similar concepts in different forms.*

The subdivision —**Implements and appliances**, which was established under the headings **Needlework** and **Shellfish fisheries**, was replaced by the standard free-floating subdivision —**Equipment and supplies**.

The phrase headings **Activity programs in Christian education** and **Activity programs in Jewish religious education** were replaced by use of the subdivision —**Activity programs** under the headings **Christian education** and **Jewish religious education**. The subdivision —**Activity programs** is used under other types of education.

2) *Subdivisions replaced by phrase headings.*

The heading **Credit unions—Central finance facilities** was changed to **Corporate credit unions**, and the heading **Insurance, Agricultural—Crops** was changed to **Crop insurance**.

3) *Subdivisions updated to different forms.*

The subdivisions —**Eastern** and —**Western** under the headings **World War, 1914-1918—Campaigns** and **World War, 1939-1945—Campaigns** were changed to —**Eastern Front** and —**Western Front**.

The heading **World War, 1939-1945—Gypsies** was changed to the form **Gypsies—Nazi persecution**.

4) *Subdivisions no longer free-floating.*

The subdivision —**History—Blockade, [date]**, which was free-floating under names of places, is no longer free-floating. Headings for individual blockades will be established as needed.

SUBCLASS ZA, INFORMATION RESOURCES

The LC Classification has historically been deficient in accommodating general works on information resources. In recent years, as new information media such as computer networks, databases, online services, and CD-ROMs have emerged, this deficiency has become more and more acute. In order to remedy this problem, the Library of Congress is proposing to establish a new subclass, tentatively designated as ZA, with the title *Information Resources*. Since the creation of a new subclass will have a significant impact on those who use the LC Classification, the Library is interested in hearing reactions to this proposal from the community of users. PUBLICATIONS

CLASS R: MEDICINE

Library of Congress Classification R: Medicine, 1995 edition, is now available from the Cataloging Distribution Service of the Library of Congress. The new edition of Class R, the first revision since 1986, includes classification data created through early 1995 and has new class numbers and captions for such topics as DNA fingerprints, exercise addiction, and Lyme disease.

The 1995 edition has been produced using the new, automated system which will make revising easier and updating more rapid. It has also been printed with a more legible typeface and bound with a sturdy, laminated plastic cover to stand up to the wear and tear of daily use.

America Preserved: A Checklist of Historic Buildings, Structures, and Sites is now available from the Library's Cataloging Distribution Service. It is a comprehensive checklist of over 30,000 structures and sites documented by the National Park Service through its Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) and the Historic American Engineering Record (HAER) programs. The sites and structures, many of which no longer exist, are permanently recorded in the form of measured drawings, photographs, written descriptive historical data, photo captions, and field records. This volume supersedes the 1983 edition *Historic America: Buildings, Structures, and Sites* with the addition of over 14,000 new entries.

America Preserved includes many features that make it an especially valuable reference tool for librarians and an important resource for architects, historians, and the general public. It features a comprehensive checklist of structures and an index by county, which has been fully updated and enhanced since the publication of the 1983 survey. For the first time, each entry includes the number of items for each type of material cited (the number of measured drawings, photographs and/or pages of text). It also includes Library of Congress shelflist numbers to help librarians locate materials more quickly. Finally, the revised introduction provides guidelines for using the book and for ordering copies of measured drawings and photographs from the Photoduplication Service of the Library of Congress.
