Dear Undersecretary Cohen,

We are writing to offer our strong support for the efforts related to the Old Dominion University-led proposal for the Department of Homeland Security, University Center of Excellence for Command, Control and Interoperability. We believe the team assembled by Old Dominion University (ODU) has a great deal to offer with respect to knowledge, expertise, diversity and experience in issues and challenges related to enabling diverse stakeholders across multiple levels of government with secured reliable and relevant communication and information.

We understand the importance of this Center of Excellence and its focus on the research necessary to improve and advance the strategic and operational capabilities and resources for command, control, and interoperability. ODU's Virginia Modeling Analysis and Simulation Center (VMASC) will lead a team composed of Hampton University, James Madison University, University of Virginia, Norfolk State University and Virginia State University. We are confident that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will be well served by this team.

There is a particularly strong advantage for locating the DHS University Center of Excellence (UCOE) in the Hampton Roads Region, which is strategically important to the overall security and economic viability of the United States. The Department of Defense infrastructure and operational commands located in this region provide the most significant sustaining capability for U.S. military forces of any geographic region in the country. The importance of major military and commercial air, land and sea lines of communication that begin and end in Hampton Roads cannot be overstated. Co-locating the UCOE with universities in Virginia would provide DHS with highly qualified higher education institutions, critical infrastructures, and networks with long standing partnerships, capabilities, and assets in conducting research, experimentation and emergency management exercises that link to military C2 commands. It is imperative that these capabilities be integrated with DHS for overall planning and execution in times of crisis.
