## CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES [ARTICLE IV, SECTIONS 3-4] §187-§189

§187. Admission and formation of new States

SECTION 3. <sup>1</sup>New States may be admitted by the Congress into this Union; but no new State shall be formed or erected within the Jurisdiction of

any other State; nor any State be formed by the Junction of two or more States, or Parts of States, without the Consent of the Legislatures of the States concerned as well as of the Congress.

<sup>2</sup> The Congress shall have Power to dispose of and make all needful Rules and §188. Power of **Congress over** Regulations respecting the Territerritory and other national property. tory or other Property belonging to the United States; and nothing in this Constitution shall be so construed as to Prejudice any Claims of the United States, or of any particular State.

The Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit has held that the property clause does not prohibit the transfer of United States property to foreign nations through self-executing treaties. Edwards v. Carter, 580 F.2d 1055 (1978), cert. denied, 436 U.S. 907 (1978).

SECTION 4. The United States shall guarantee §189. Republican form to every State in this Union a Reof government and publican Form of Government, and protection from domestic violence shall protect each of them against guaranteed to the Invasion; and on Application of the States. Legislature, or of the Executive

(when the Legislature cannot be convened) against domestic violence.
