UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

David W. Ogden (Cal. No. 21)

Ordered, That at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, March 11, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of David W. Ogden, of Virginia, to be Deputy Attorney General; and that the time until 4:30 p.m., be equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees; that when the Senate resumes consideration of the nomination on Thursday, March 12, 2009, there be 2 hours remaining for debate, equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees; that upon the use of the time on Thursday, the Senate then proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation of the nomination, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, no further motions be in order, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.
