UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT Elena Kagan (Cal. No. 22)

Ordered, That at 2 p.m. on Thursday, March 19, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Elena Kagan, of Massachusetts, to be Solicitor General of the United States; that there be 6 hours of debate with respect to the nomination, with the time equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. Specter), or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table; no further motions be in order, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate resume legislative session.
