UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT Thomas L. Strickland (Cal. No. 56)

Ordered, That following the offering of the Dodd-Shelby substitute amendment to S. 896, the Senate then proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Thomas L. Strickland, of Colorado, to be Assistant Secretary for Fish and Wildlife; that there be 3 hours of debate with respect to the nomination, with 1 hour under the control of the Majority, and 2 hours under the control of the Republicans, and 30 minutes of the Republican time under the control of the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. Bunning); that upon the use or yielding back of time, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that the confirmation require an affirmative 60 vote threshold; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, no further motions be in order; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.
