UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT Gary Gensler (Cal. Nos. 29 and 30)

Ordered, That on Tuesday, May 19, 2009, following disposition of H.R. 627, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Gary Gensler, Maryland, to be a Commissioner of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission; provided, that there be 60 minutes of debate with respect to the nomination, with the time equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Iowa (Mr. Harkin) and the Senator from Georgia (Mr. Chambliss), or their designees, with the Senator from Washington (Ms. Cantwell), the Senator from Maryland (Mr. Cardin) and the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Sanders) each controlling 5 minutes of the Majority's time; that at 2:15 p.m., the Senate proceed to a vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation of the nomination, the Senate then proceed to the nomination of Gary Gensler, Maryland, to be Chairman of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission; that the nomination be confirmed and the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table; that no further motions be in order; that the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate then resume legislative session.


