Ordered, That relative to the cloture motion filed on the nomination of Harold Hongju Koh, of Connecticut, to be Legal Adviser of the Department of State, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That upon the conclusion of the impeachment proceedings on Wednesday, June 24, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session with the time until 11 a.m. equally divided and controlled between the Leaders or their designees and that at 11 a.m. the Senate vote to a motion to invoke cloture on the nomination.
