UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Robert M. Groves (Cal. No. 169)

Ordered, That at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, July 13, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session and there be 1 hour of debate prior to a vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Robert M. Groves, of Michigan, to be Director of the Census, with the time divided as follows: 15 minutes each: the Senator from Maine (Ms. Collins, the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Shelby) and the Senator from Louisiana (Mr. Vitter) with 15 minutes equally divided between the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Lieberman) and the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Carper); provided further, that at 5:30 p.m., the Senate proceed to vote on the motion to invoke cloture; that if cloture is invoked, then all post-cloture time be yielded back and the Senate immediately vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table; no further motions be in order, the President then be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived.
