UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT
Sonia Sotomayor (Cal. No. 309)

Ordered, That at 10:00 a.m on Thursday, August 6, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Sonia Sotomayor, of New York, to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States; that the time until 2:00 p.m. be divided equally in alternating one-hour blocks with the Republicans controlling the first hour; that at 2:00 p.m., the time be divided 15 minutes each as follows: the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions), the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy), the Senator from Kentucky (Mr. McConnell), and the Senator from Nevada (Mr. Reid), in that order; that at 3:00 p.m., without further intervening action or debate, the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table, no further motions be in order, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate then resume legislative session.
