## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

### Thomas E. Perez (Cal. No. 186)

*Ordered*, That at 10 a.m., on Tuesday, October 6, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Thomas E. Perez, of Maryland, to be an Assistant Attorney General; and that once the nomination is reported, the cloture motion which will be at the desk be stated; further that the reading of the names then be waived; and the mandatory quorum be waived; that immediately thereafter, the Senate debate the nomination until 12:15 p.m., with the time equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions), or their designees; that at 12:15 p.m., the Senate proceed to vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination; that if cloture is invoked on the nomination, then all post cloture time be yielded back, and the Senate then vote immediately on confirmation of the nomination; that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table that no further motions be in order; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate resume legislative session; provided further that if cloture is not invoked on the nomination, then a motion to reconsider the vote by which cloture was not invoked on the nomination be considered entered; the Senate then resume legislative session and recess until 2:15 p.m.
