UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Andre M. Davis (Cal. No. 185)

Ordered, That at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, November 9, 2009, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Andre M. Davis, of Maryland, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Fourth Circuit; that debate be limited to 60 minutes equally divided and controlled between the Senator from Vermont (Mr. Leahy) and the Senator from Alabama (Mr. Sessions) or their designees; that at 5:30 p.m., the Senate proceed to vote on confirmation of the nomination, that upon confirmation, the motion to reconsider be laid on the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate resume legislative session.
