UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Robert E. Bacharach (Cal. No. 759)

Ordered, That at 4:30 p.m. on Monday, July 30, 2012, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Robert E. Bacharach, of Oklahoma, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Tenth Circuit with one hour of debate equally divided and controlled in the usual form prior to a cloture vote on the nomination; *provided further*, that if cloture is not invoked on the nomination, the Senate then resume legislative session and adopt the motion to proceed to S. 3414, the Cybersecurity Act of 2012, and that if cloture is invoked on the nomination, upon disposition of the Bacharach nomination, and the Senate resume legislative session.

Ordered, That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Robert E. Bacharach, of Oklahoma, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Tenth Circuit, the mandatory quorum call required under Rule XXII be waived.
