Hours of Operation

Active duty Soldiers medical care: Monday - Friday, 6:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

Family member medical care: 7:30 a.m. - 4:30 pm

Ancillary Services: 7 a.m. - 5 p.m.

The Specialist Jordan M. Byrd Health Clinic staff members provide primary medical care services to approximately 4,800 active duty Family members. Five primary care providers offer care to some of their previously empanelled patients from Blanchfield Army Community Hospital as well Family members living in Fort Campbell's Gardner Hills, The Woodlands and Cole Park housing areas.

A total of 7,000 Soldiers assigned to the Sustainment Brigade, 159th Aviation Brigade, and Tenant units will receive their primary care services at the Byrd Health.

In addition to primary care services for Soldiers and Family members assigned to the clinic, Byrd Health Clinic offers radiology and laboratory services as well as a pharmacy to fill new prescriptions from Byrd clinic providers. Optometry, physical therapy and audiology will be available to active duty service members.

Appointments

Sick Call services for Soldiers are conducted at within their units. Soldiers should report to their assigned medical personnel in accordance with their unit's Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).

SPC Jordan M. Byrd



The Byrd Health Clinic was dedicated and named for SPC Jordan M. Byrd, (Nov. 16, 1990 – Oct. 13, 2010), an Army Combat Medic who posthumously received the Silver Star and was promoted for his actions supporting Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

The official Silver Star citation states:

For gallantry in action against the enemy as a Combat Medic with the 1st Battalion, 506th Infantry Regiment, 4th Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division. While on patrol, his element came under intense small arms, rocket-propelled grenade, and mortar fire. With complete disregard for his own personal safety, he maneuvered through the enemy kill zone across 30 meters of open terrain to render lifesaving aid to a fellow comrade. Private

First Class Byrd's distinctive accomplishments are in keeping with the finest traditions of military service and reflect great credit upon himself, Task Force Red Currahee, Combined Task Force Currahee, Combined Joint Task Force-101 and the United States Army.

His awards and decorations include: The Silver Star, The Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, Combat Medical Badge, and Expert Marksmanship Badge.

Jordan is survived by his wife Savanna, son Ayden, mother and father, Roberta and Scott Pitt, Father Justin Brost (Jennifer), sisters Abby Byrd, Maddie (Mitch) Klupenher, Sidney Emmily Brost, brother Nicholas Torrence Brown, Tyler Corbett, Trevor Brost, grandparents Richard and Dorothy Pitt, Bully and Nancy Byrd, and Gearlad and Justina Brost.
