Questi	ons to consider for the search and selection process:
•	How many participants expected to be involved in the process?
•	Who are they and what interests are represented?
•	What is the expected outcome of the process? (e.g, an agreement/settlement of a lawsuit; a consensus-based recommendation; a negotiated rule; improved capacity of participants to work together.")
•	What skills, knowledge and experience is important to them in selecting a third-party impartial practitioner?
•	What substantive issues, process experience, other background/experience would be helpful?
•	Where will mediation, meeting, etc. take place?
•	Location of practitioner: Is knowledge of local culture/issues helpful? Must the practitioner live in the locale or is having worked in the region sufficient? Or is it more helpful to have someone from outside locale? Why or why not?
•	Fees and costs (fees for services; travel, logistics; space; copying, etc.): How will they be paid? (fees can be shared equally or disproportionately or paid by one entity, and can include in-kind contributions)

Is the situation sufficiently complex or are there other factors (e.g., short timeline to complete, wide geographic distribution of participants) that indicate a team of practitioners should be considered?

Who will select practitioner? How? (see Choosing an Appropriate Neutral)
