**Purpose :** To provide training to officers selected for assignment to the U.S. Army Recruiting Command (USAREC) as operations officers.

**Scope :** The curriculum is designed to provide training in the principles of The Army Interview, time management, personnel procurement, the enlistment process to include eligibility, incentives, prospecting and the management systems used to evaluate accomplishment of the recruiting mission.

**Prerequisites :** Active Army officers (captain through colonel) selected for attendance by PERSCOM and USAREC to serve as operation officers.

This course will be conducted using the Virtual Classroom Server (VCS) via the internet. Listed below are the requirements that must be me to accomplish the VCS training.

1. Students must be able to access the ALMS. All students must have a headphone with microphone to participate with classroom discussions.

- 2. Students must have a suitable location that is free of distractions for 8 hours a day.
- 3. Students must have paper regulations (See the required reading).
- 4. E-mail access (For homework, practical exercises, and testing).

5. There will be a "systems check" conducted on the Friday before class begins. All students will login to the ALMS (through attached link) between the hours of 1000 and 1130 hrs Eastern Standard time. When you successfully login an instructor at the RRS will give you further instructions, and issue the training schedule for the 2 weeks.
