To: People Interested in the Proposed Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes land acquisitions under the Federal Columbia River Power System Mitigation Program

The Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) is proposing to fund the purchase of two properties in Lake County, MT—the 112 acre Skidoo Creek property and the five acre Post Creek Property. When the transactions are complete, the properties would be owned and managed for fish and wildlife habitat conservation purposes by the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes (CSKT). To ensure that the habitat values are protected in perpetuity, BPA will receive a conservation easement for each property. BPA is sending this letter to inform nearby residents and other interested parties of these proposed land purchases.

The funding would be provided as part of BPA's ongoing efforts to protect, restore and enhance westslope cutthroat trout and bull trout habitat in Montana. Purchasing the land would serve as partial mitigation for the construction and operation of the Hungry Horse Dam on the South Fork Flathead River.

Enclosed you will find maps describing the land transactions. BPA has prepared a memo and environmental checklist documenting that funding the purchase of the properties would be categorically excluded under the National Environmental Policy Act, and that further environmental review of this funding action is not required. This categorical exclusion was approved on September 7, 2012, and is posted on BPA's website at: http://www.efw.bpa.gov/environmental_services/categoricalexclusions.aspx


The CSKT would provide long-term management of the land and would develop a management plan to guide the protection and enhancement of habitat resources. CSKT will provide the opportunity for the public to review and comment on the plan. BPA must review and approve the plan before it is implemented.

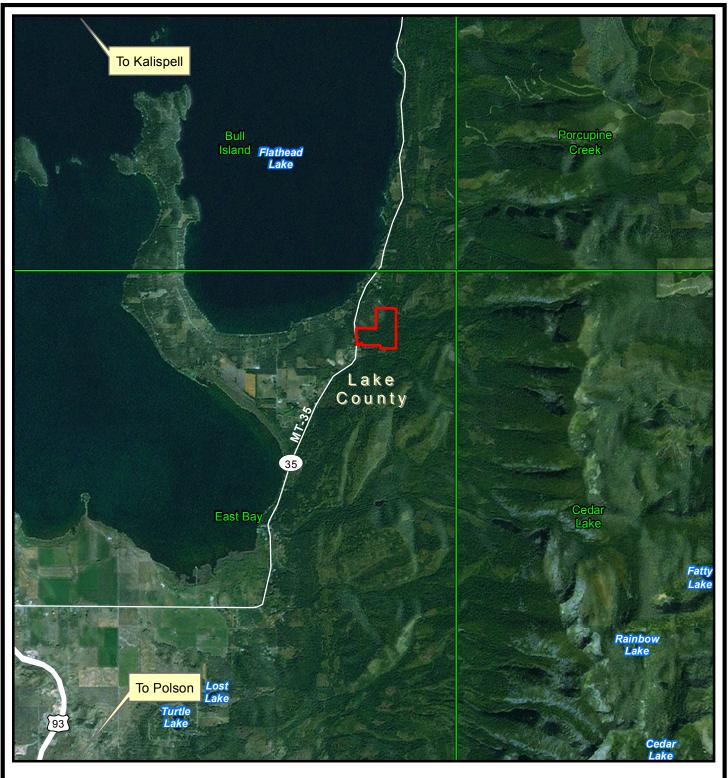



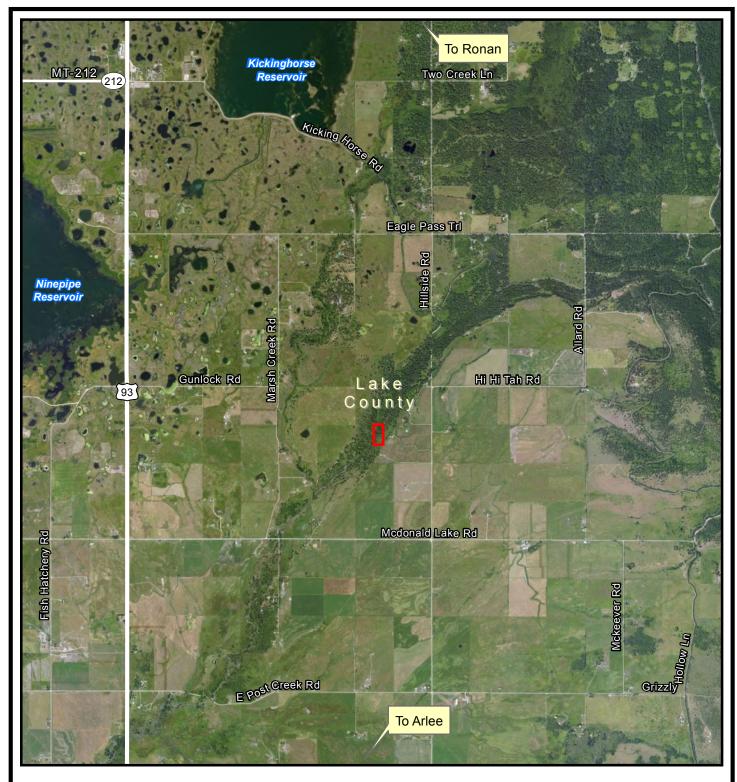


Skidoo Creek Land Acquisition East Bay Quadrangle (Approx. 112 Acres)
