

Section C2G-8.1.1.2 of the specifications list requirements for substitute sheet pile sections and includes depth limitations. The referenced letter acknowledges that the product does not meet the depth requirement listed in the specifications. The supplier should be directed to bid the project in accordance with the advertised plans and specifications.

As in any project, bids must be in compliance with the issued plans and specifications. If a contractor or supplier discovers a discrepancy or cost savings measure during the bidding process, general procedure has been to issue an amendment so that all bidders are simultaneously notified of the change. Substitutions made after contract award would be handled by a contract modification or the value engineering program as appropriate.

We do not intend to issue an amendment that would permit an increase in the sheet pile depth.

We request consideration and approval to bid AZ-13 as a substitute to PZ-22. AZ-13 meets all specifications except the depth is 11.93", which is approximately 25% greater than PZ-22, or 10% greater than the allowable 9" \pm 15% specification.

Note: AZ-13 is manufactured in Luxembourg, but according to Presidential Executive Order 12849, May, 1993 (implementation of agreement with European Community on government procurement), could be used on Corps projects bid in excess of \$6 million.

Memorandum for Ray Burgess, Asst. Chief, Contracting Division

SUBJECT: Member Nations of the EC for application of Executive Order 12849

1. We may have a contractual problem on the St. Francisville Mat Casting Field contract which is a supply contract. The Contractor has informally asked about supplying Spanish cement. We felt it was about time to see which European nations were member nations. (My last informal memo to you concluded that we would have to determine who they are.) The attached enclosure indicates the member nations are BELGIUM, BRITAIN, DENMARK, FRANCE, GERMANY, GREECE, IRELAND, ITALY, LUXEMBOURG, NETHERLANDS, PORTUGAL AND SPAIN.

Four more nations have made application (Norway, Sweden, Finland and Austria), but it will be some time to see if they are accepted.

2. For your information the EC (European Community) has now been changed to EU or European Union. (newsclip also attached.)

3. With respect to the possible matter involving the mat-casting field (see paragraph 1), as far as I know, the Cargo Preference Act still applies with equal force and effect and will probably prevent us from accepting Spanish cement transported to the job in a vessel of non-domestic origin, even though we might not apply any differential to the Spanish cement.



SUBJECT: Executive Order (EO) 12849

EO 12849 (enclosure #1), issued May 25, 1993 implements certain agreements with the European Community on Government Procurement. The EO is applicable to all elements of the Department of Defense, and does not provide an exemption for the Corps of Engineers or any of their programs, including civil works.

Please take action to inform all your contracting activities of the requirements of this Executive Order. The Director of the Defense Acquisition Regulatory (DAR) Council has advised (enclosure #2) that the DFARS will not be revised to implement the EO, and that the Corps should consider local implementation. I concur with that assessment.

Executive Order 12849 of May 25, 1993

Implementation of Agreement With the European Community
on Government Procurement

58 F.R. 30931

WHEREAS, the United States and the European Community (EC) have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding on Government Procurement (Agreement) that provides appropriate reciprocal competitive government procurement opportunities;

WHEREAS, the commitments made in the Agreement are intended to become part of an expanded General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Agreement on Government Procurement (GATT Code) and are an important step toward an expanded GATT Code;

WHEREAS, as a result of these commitments, U.S. businesses will obtain increased access to EC member state procurement for U.S. goods and services;

WHEREAS, I have determined that it is inconsistent with the public interest to apply the restrictions of the Buy American Act, as amended (41 U.S.C. 10a-10d), to procurement covered by the Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, including section 301 of title 3, United States Code, and title III of the Trade Agreements Act of 1979, as amended (19 U.S.C. 2511-2518), and in order to implement the Agreement, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. In applying the provisions of the Buy American Act, the heads of the agencies listed in Annex 1, Parts A and B, of this order are requested, as of the date of this order, to apply no price differential between articles, materials, or supplies of U.S. origin and those originating in the member states of the EC.

Sec. 2. For purposes of this order, the rule of origin specified in section 308 of the Trade Agreements Act of 1979, as amended (19 U.S.C. 2518), shall apply in determining whether goods originate in the member states of the EC.

Sec. 3. This order shall apply only to solicitations, issued by agencies listed in Annex 1, Parts A and B, of this order, above the threshold amounts set forth in Annex 2.

Sec. 4. This order shall apply to solicitations outstanding on the date of this order, except for those for which the initial deadline for receipt of bids or proposals has passed, and to all solicitations issued after the date of this order.

Sec. 5. Except for procurements by the Department of Defense, the United States Trade Representative (USTR) shall be responsible for interpretation of the Agreement. The USTR shall seek the advice of the interagency organization established under section 242(a) of the Trade Expansion Act of 1962 (19 U.S.C. 1872(a)) and consult with affected agencies, including the Office of Federal Procurement Policy.

EXECUTIVE ORDERS

Sec. 6. This Executive order is effective immediately. Although regulatory implementation of this order must await revisions to the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), it is expected that agencies listed in Annex 1, Parts A and B, of this order will take all appropriate actions in the interim to implement those aspects of the order that are not dependent upon regulatory revision.

Sec. 7. Pursuant to section 25 of the Office of Federal Procurement Policy Act, as amended (41 U.S.C. 421(a)), the Federal Acquisition Regulatory Council shall ensure that the policies established herein are incorporated in the FAR within 30 days from the date this order is issued.

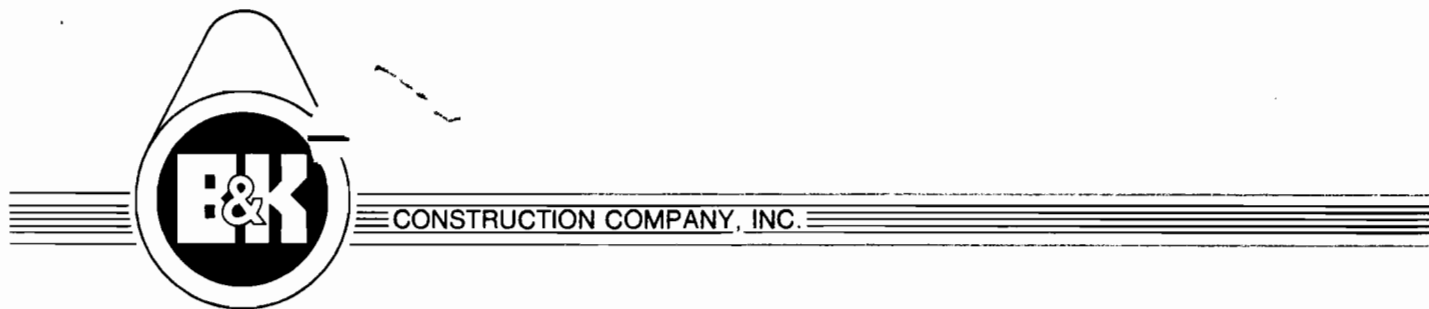

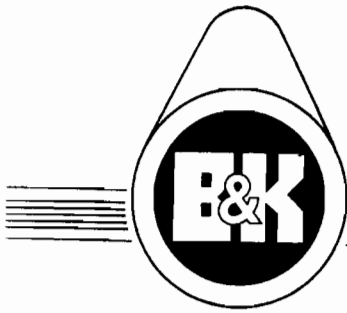

Enclosed is a letter one of my Senior Project Managers, Terral Broussard, received from the chairman of your Engineering Committee, Richard D. Sackett. Mr. Sackett was responding to a letter Mr. Broussard sent to your Chief Engineer, Stevan Spencer, requesting Orleans Levee District funds for the relocations included with the Parallel Protection floodwall Contract No. 3 on the London Avenue Outfall Canal. A copy of this letter is also enclosed.

The plans and specifications for this contract were prepared by Burk-Kleinpeter, Inc. under contract to your Board. In accordance with the agreements between our offices, your Board furnished us the plans and specifications for us to advertise. You have furnished us right-of-entry to the right-of-way required for the construction. We, therefore, were ready to advertise for bids upon a favorable response to Mr. Broussard's letter.

Given Mr. Sackett's letter, we cannot advertise the contract and must delay this critical flood control project until we are assured your Board will furnish the required funds to cover the cost of the relocations included with the floodwall contract. We cannot proceed with floodwall construction until this issue is resolved.


