

The new road will reduce the cost and time required to transport goods and services, as well as losses to the national economy resulting from deteriorated road conditions.	The works and construction supervision teams are in place. They have set up offices and work- ers' camps at the project sites, imported required construction equipment and prepared the required work plans.	The Moldovan Government has hit all road maintenance fund targets to date. Works contractors' mobilization is nearly completed. The first installments of the advance payments to contractors have been made. The construction supervision consultants, works contractors, and MCA-Moldova have established effective work relationships - necessary to greatly reduce or eliminate project completion and quality risks.
